REUBEN'S RAMBLINGS

The Commission in Great Matthew 28:19-20 calls us to share our faith and to help others know and accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. However, we as a church sometimes pursue Christ's Commission under misconceptions. For example, many churches believe that faith-sharing is a program of the local church and assigned to a committee. When in fact faithsharing is the real ministry and commission of each Christian. Another misconception is that there is only one way or approach for faith-sharing. As each one of us is unique in God's eyes, so each one of us shares our faith in different ways, as led by the Holy Spirit. To assume that a certain model is the only way puts a tragic limitation on the power of the gospel. Also, no special training or degree is needed. It's your story, your personal relationship with Jesus Christ; so, share it from your heart.

We also mistakenly believe that all the people around us have some knowledge of Jesus Christ and the Bible. Recent surveys show that many people, especially youth and young adults, cannot name the four Gospels, or even name who gave us the Sermon on the Mount. This emphasizes the great need for Christian education and Bible study.

Finally, many believe that faithsharing, bringing people to Christ, is the sole responsibility of the clergy. However, when Jesus gave us the Great Commission, He was not just talking to pastors, He was speaking to all who follow Him. Each one of us is called to tell our story, what Jesus Christ means to us personally. Telling others about Jesus is harder than giving money, serving in the Pantry, participating on a mission project, singing in the choir, and many other important tasks that are part of the life of the church. But there is a time to speak. Words are important. There comes a time when we must share our faith with others.

More that seventy-five percent of the people who become Christians do so because of the testimony, deeds, and encouragement of someone they know and trust. Survey after survey and study after study report that when new members are asked why they chose their church, they respond by pointing to the influence of people in their social network. Research also indicates that the average church member can identify at least six to eight unchurched March, 2024, Issue 3

friends, family members and associates who live within a reasonable distance of their local church.

Each of us is called to spread the gospel by word and deed. Do we fulfill our calling? I firmly believe that we have taken this for granted and need to reemphasize our mission, our calling. Over the next weeks and months, I hope and pray that you will join me on a journey of faith, a journey of faith-sharing. I ask you help in three areas. First, pray for those you believe need to find Christ and a church home. Pray for guidance on how to approach them. Second, be sensitive to the opportunities around you to share your faith. And finally, invite at least two people to church. There are people in our community who are waiting to hear the good news and wanting to find a church home. May we as a church help them find Christ and a welcoming home. Together we can help build God's kingdom and fulfill our calling in the Great Commission. God Bless.

Life Changing Snapshots Provided by High Desert

Some of my heroes are people who do things I cannot or will not do! We at High Desert support some of the work of two people who in my eyes have become heroes. Rev. Joanne Landry and Rev. Chris Davis have both lived over fifteen years in locations that are dangerous where they serve people they see as made in the image of Christ. The people they serve have nothing and yet they give back because of the these two models of Christ in action. Wanda and I want to thank you, Church, for allowing us to deliver food you purchase to these heroes. Because of those contacts our lives are enriched.

Snapshots do not tell the entire story but they give you some picture of what we value in life. Snapshot number one happened in Gallup. We were delivering lunch bags to the homeless with Rev. Davis. In these settings I aways see more than the primary purpose for being in a strange environment. On one occasion, I watched a young policeman help an inebriated senior citizen to a van to take him to a warm detox. The policeman was talking and helping the senior homeless gentleman with care. What I saw and heard was that he was treating this person as if he were the policeman's grandfather. We could learn. This to me was truly a Christlike act.

Snapshot number two was on the street outside Rev. Joanne Landry's Church. The background: Tensions were high in the neighborhood because after the homeless were kicked out of Albuquerque city parks the homeless had no place to go. Streets in the International Zone, formerly the war zone, of Albuquerque were filling up with homeless. Neighbors were anxious because they felt unsafe. Albuquerque's Mayor had even been to the area a couple of times to solicit Rev. Laundry's help and to provide her with some assistance. Wanda and I show up at Rev. Laundry's when the tension is high in the neighborhood. Because Rev. Landry always treats the homeless with respect, they seem to see regular visitors as safe as well so when we arrived two homeless men left the shopping cart tent and walked to our car while we were unloading. As is my standard practice, I shook hands and greeting them. Immediately, they started right in telling me about a neighbor pulling a gun on them and that they didn't know what to do. I listened. Often that is all people want is a little respect, eye contact and a calm ear. The point is we connected, if only for a moment.

Thank you, because you have given me this snapshot of seeing my life change for a moment and their life also change if only for a moment. Some take away thoughts from these moments that I carry are: Only for the grace of God go I. What courage it must take just to survive on the street. These folks are created in the image of God just as I am. Respect is powerful. If you are involved in our missions program you too develop life changing snapshots. Thank you! Gordon Golsan

Chris at our February Women With Purpose meeting. She plans to use the funds to start a summer sidewalk ministry to children at a large apartment complex in Gallup. Pictured above are two grateful recipients of the hoodies we sent to Gallup.

During the month of February, we collected \$1,435 for hoodies for High Schoolers (and Middle Schoolers.) Due to your generosity, we were able to purchase enough hoodies to take a dozen to each High School in Rio Rancho, Bernalillo, Cuba, and Jemez, plus a dozen to each Middle School in Rio Rancho. As a bonus we were also able to take a dozen hoodies to one elementary school, where we knew of a particular need. The staff at each school were most appreciative. One school counselor stated that she had a student who needed a hoodie that very day.

At High Desert, we are so blessed to have such a caring congregation!
