















A walk with Jesus—Story

A walk with Jesus—play dough recipe

Playdough recipe (other recipes available)

Please check allergies you will need

- 8 tbsp plain flour
- 2 tbsp table salt
- 60ml warm water
- food colouring
- 1 tbsp vegetable oil

Method

- 1. Mix the flour and salt in a large bowl. In a separate bowl mix together the water, a few drops of food colouring and the oil.
- 2. Pour the coloured water into the flour mix and bring together with a spoon.
- 3. Dust a work surface with a little flour and turn out the dough. Knead together for a few minutes to form a smooth, pliable dough. If you want a more intense colour you can work in a few extra drops of food colouring.
 - 4. Store in a plastic sandwich bag (squeeze out the air) in the fridge to keep it fresh.



A walk with Jesus—craft ideas

1. Foot prints

Draw around your feet on a long piece of paper. This activity will remind us of the walk to Emmaus. It will be a lovely keepsake for a family, write your name and date on the feet.

2. Food collage on a plate.

Collect your favourite food pictures (if magazines are available)

Cut out pictures and glue the pictures on a paper plate

Write a prayer of thanks for food and family





3. Have a tea party— children can have a teddy bear tea party or look up a recipe and cook together, is there someone you can cook for (if food is available), remember to stay safe and stay in.
