## Dies Needed:

GO! Qube Mix \& Match 8" Block (55776)

- GO! Square-4-1/2" (4" Finished) (Shape 1)
- GO! Half Square Triangle-4" Finished Square (Shape 3)
- GO! Half Square Triangle-2" Finished Square (Shape 5)
- GO! Rectangle-2-1/2" x 4-1/2" (2" x 4" Finished) (Shape 8)

GO! Qube 8" Companion Set - Angles (55789)

- GO! Trapezoid $45^{\circ}-1-15 / 16$ "H x $6-3 / 8 "$ W Cut (4" Finished Square) (Shape 16)


## Additional Dies Needed

- GO! Strip Cutter-2-1/2" (2" Finished) (55014 or 55017)
- GO! Airplanes (55366)


## Fabric Requirements:

| Fabric Color | Total Yardage |
| :--- | :---: |
| White | $1-1 / 2$ yards |
| Blue | 1 yard |
| Green | $1 / 2$ yard |
| Red | $1 / 8$ yard |
| Yellow | $1 / 8$ yard |
| Black | $4 " \times 10^{\prime \prime}$ |
| Batting | $50^{\prime \prime} \times 58^{\prime \prime}$ |
| Backing | $50^{\prime \prime} \times 58^{\prime \prime}$ |
| Fusible | $1-1 / 2$ yards |

NOTE: Apply fusible to back of appliqué fabrics according to manufacturer's instructions before cutting shapes.

Cut \& Shift ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ method to save fabric when cutting angled shapes: Start at one end of fabric, place over the shape, layer fabric if desired. Continue to cut and shift the fabric strip downward to align cut angle of fabric with angle of blades to cut the next trapezoid across the width of fabric.

## Cutting Directions:

| Fabric <br> Color | Die | Number of Shapes to Cut |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| White | GO! Square-4-1/2" (4" <br> Finished) (Shape 1) | Cut 6-5" x width of fabric (WOF) strips. Fanfold into <br> 5" widths. Sub cut into 48-4" square finished. |
| White | GO! Half Square <br> Triangle-4" Finished <br> Square (Shape 3) | Cut 2—5-3/8" x WOF strips. Fanfold into 5-3/8" <br> widths. Sub cut into 24—4" finished half square <br> triangle (HST). |
| Blue | GO! Trapezoid 45"-1- <br> $15 / 16 " H ~ x ~ 6-3 / 8 " W ~$ | Cut 2—5-3/4" x WOF strips. Use Cut \& Shift method. |
|  | Cut—4" Finished <br> Square (Shape 16) | Sub cut into 24-4" finished trapezoids. |

## Sewing Directions:

Press all seams open and use $11 / 4$ " seams, unless otherwise indicated.
Blocks:

1. Sew one blue $4 "$ finished trapezoid (Shape 16) and one green 2 " finished half square triangle (HST) (Shape 5) together as shown. Make 24
 blue/green units.
2. Sew one white 4 " finished HST (Shape 3) and blue/green unit together as shown. Make 24-4" finished trapezoid units.

3. Sew two 4" finished trapezoid units together as shown. Make $12-4$ " x 8 " finished Chevron blocks.
4. Sew one white 4 " finished square (Shape 1) to one white 4" finished square together as shown. Press seams to one side. Make 24-2-patch
 units.
5. Sew one white 2-patch unit to one white 2-patch unit together as shown. Spin seams in opposite directions. Make 12-8" x 8" finished 4-patch blocks.

6. Sew one blue 2" x 4" finished rectangle (Shape 8) to one green 2" x 4" finished rectangle (Shape 8) together as shown. Make 12-4" finished rectangle blocks.


## Assemble the Quilt Top

1. Sew 3 chevron blocks and 3—4-patch blocks together as shown. Press to 4-patch blocks. Make 4 chevron rows.

2. Sew 9 rectangle blocks together as shown. Press seams to one side. Make 3 rectangle rows.

3. Sew chevron and rectangle rows together as shown. Press seams to one side.

4. Measure quilt top to bottom. Cut 2 border strips to that length. Sew border strips to right and left sides of quilt center. Press to borders.
5. Measure quilt top right to left. Cut 2 border strips to that length. Sew border strips to top and bottom of quilt center. Press to borders.
6. Apply airplane shapes onto quilt top as shown.

Airplane Appliqué
The airplanes will be appliquéd onto the pieced quilt blocks. The airplanes and bi-planes will be stitched onto the white 4-patch blocks as shown. Detailed instructions are included with the free machine embroidery download from www.accuquilt.com/airplanes55366.

## Quilting and Finishing

1. Layer batting between quilt top and backing.
2. Pin or baste layers together.
3. Quilt as desired.
4. Add binding, mitering corners.
