OKTOBERFEST 2023





This year marks the 188th anniversary of the famed Oktoberfest, held annually in Munich at the Theresienwiese. There will be 17 large tents, mostly sponsored by the biggest breweries, and 21 small tents, from specialty donuts to wine bars, bratwurst, dumplings, rotisserie chickens and coffee. On October 17, 1810 the first Oktoberfest was a horse race on the occasion of the wedding of Prince Regent Ludwig of Bavaria, later King Ludwig I, and Princess Therese of Saxony-Hildburghausen. Originally the festival was held in October, until 1871. Because the weather tends to be cooler and wetter in October, it was changed in 1872 to begin on the first Saturday after the 15th until the first Sunday in October. The festival is organized and managed by

Munich County administration (Landeshauptstadt Muenchen) and the Ministry for Employment and Commerce (Referat fuer Arbeit und Wirtschaft). Want to know more? Go to www.oktoberfest.de
