Toolbox Activity:

5 questions True / False Condom quiz 1: Small Group Discussion

Purpose:

Talking in small groups enables civil discussion and the opportunity to listen your team members ideas about sex, gender and condom use.

- Divide into groups of 4 - 6. Have enough condoms or boxes of condoms so everyone can have a condom in their hand
- Appoint a moderator – who can call an end to any discussion.
- The moderator ask each person to read a statement out loud, offer an opinion. The group to discusses and aims to reach a consensus response to the statement.
- Plan your own responses before talking to colleagues or family members
 1. If a person uses condoms, they are not a person of good Christian character
 2. If a person is carrying a condom in their handbag, they are planning to have sexual intercourse that night.
 3. It is impolite for a woman to ask man to use a condom if they know each other
 4. Men who have a box full of condoms in their car are a danger to the public
 5. Condoms are 100% effective in preventing unplanned pregnancy, all sexually transmitted infections, and they never ever break, even after being safely stored for 5 years in the bottom of a sports bag.
 6. A man should question a woman for carrying condoms in her handbag
