**Scripture Insights**

Our Gospel passage today takes place after John's witness to Jesus (John 1:19—28) and John's identification of Jesus as "the Lamb of God, Who takes away the sin of the world" (1:29—34). In this passage, we see Jesus beginning His ministry and the disciples coming to join Him in His mission. His first two disciples, Andrew and an anonymous person, were initially disciples of John the Baptizer. They only follow Jesus because of John's testimony. Jesus asks them a pointed question when He sees that they are following Him: "What


### SOUP FOR SENIORS


The prayer time is structured and Scripture-based. No advance preparation required. You only need to show up. Contact Karen Sobiechowski for questions or if you would like to participate.







are you looking for?" (1:38). Instead of answering Jesus' question, the men acknowledge Jesus as "rabbi," and ask where he is staying, thus seemingly suggesting their desire to simply be with Jesus. The word stay, both in the Greek and in the biblical translation used for the lectionary, is repeated three times in two verses. Moreover, it is the same verb that Jesus will use when He pronounces later in John 15: "Remain in me as I remain in you" (15:4).

After that question, Jesus issues them an authoritative invitation (the Greek for come is an imperative) and gives them a promise (literally in the Greek, "You will see"). Notice how this passage is replete with reference to "watching," "looking," or "seeing" (1:36, 38, 39, 42). By "staying" or "remaining" with Jesus, Andrew sees that

Jesus is the Messiah. Just as John the Baptizer has done, Andrew proceeds to give a testimony about Jesus to His brother, Simon. The text puts much emphasis on Andrew's initiative: he seeks Simon out and then he brings Simon to Jesus (1:41—42). Like John the Baptist, Andrew does not focus on himself (he uses the first-person plural, "we," in 1:41) but focuses instead on pointing others to Jesus.

- How and to whom can you be a witness for Jesus today?
- What does it take to "stay" or "remain" with Jesus?
- How has Christ changed your vision? What has He enabled you to see and see differently?

### **Practice of Hope**

Eli instructed Samuel to tell the Lord, "Speak, for your servant is listening." Too often we say, "Listen, Lord, for your servant is speaking."

- Choose a day this week to turn off the television and your cell phone, and to avoid all social media. Find a quiet place to listen to the Lord. If you aren't sure how to listen for God, read slowly through one of the readings several times, then note a word or phrase that catches your attention. Ponder this word or phrase. Notice the thoughts and feelings that emerge within you. What response does God offer you?
- St. Paul assures us that our bodies are part of the Body of Christ and are, therefore, sacred. How do you treat your body? Do you get sufficient exercise and sleep? Do you eat healthy foods?
- What changes might you need to make to honor your body?

### **Questions**

- On a scale of 1 to 10, how would you rate your openness to believing? Are you very open and eager, or more reserved and skeptical when it comes to believing the incredible? Do you see your attitude as an advantage or a drawback?
- What things have you spent your life rehearsing for? Have there been opportunities that came along that you knew you were ready to embrace because somehow you'd prepared for them your whole life?
- What do you want to rehearse for the next stage in your life? What important opportunity do you want to be ready for?


