John 15 is part of a longer discourse by Jesus (John 14—17) to help prepare his disciples for His death. Today's Gospel reading revolves around three figures: God as the vine grower, Jesus as the vine, and Jesus' followers as the branches. We are invited to "remain" in Jesus, which appears eight times (four times in John 15:4; once in John 15:5 and 15:6; twice in John 15:7), and to "bear fruit," which appears six times (thrice in John 15:2; once in John 15:4, 15:5, and 15:8).

The verb translated as "remain" also appears in John 14, Continued on Page 13





Enter the Flow

There is a foundational pattern of giving and receiving in every aspect of the universe—modeled on the very shape of God as Trinity. Once we have a dynamic waterwheel of outflowing love, as St. Bonaventure called it, it flows in only one direction: always positive, always giving, always outpouring, where there is no possibility of anger, unlove, wrath, or hatred in God. The doctrine of the Trinity was developed to order to move us to the dynamic principle of three, where there is always movement forward. But the ego naturally pulls us back into the principle of two, which is inherently comparative, competitive, and antagonistic, and usually either/or. Trinity undoes that. All we can do is jump into the flow and allow it to happen. The only way of really jumping in is through standing in love—even in our mind.

"places" for people to remain or "dwell" (John 14:2) and the divine remaining with or dwelling with Jesus (John 14:10). "Remain," then, refers to a relationship in which one feels at home, and it signifies the intimate and mutual love that exists between the Father and Jesus.

Fruitfulness as the result of "remaining" is also emphasized. Ihe passage explains that the vine grower prunes to bring about growth and abundance. Moreover, bearing fruit is identified as a mark of discipleship (John 15:2, 8).

The imperatives in this passage—to "remain" (John 15:4) and to "ask" (John 15:7)—are related. If the result of "remaining" is bearing fruit, then what we are told or invited to "ask" may well be our fruitfulness—or something that has been pruned or cleansed by Jesus' teaching (John 15:2—3; see also 1 John 3:18—24). If we follow the metaphor, the fruits borne by branches of a vine are not for the branches' consumption but for others' use or benefit (see also Psalm 22:26—32).

pronoun ("you") in this passage is always in the plural?

- How may we understand the specific meaning of bearing fruit in this passage? Does the passage in Acts 9 for today help as we consider this question?
- In what ways do you find the passage from Acts meaningful on this Fifth Sunday of Easter?

Practice of Faith

The Holy Spirit brought peace to the early Church. What parts of the world are especially in need of God's peace today?

- Pray the Rosary for those trapped in regions of conflict and for those working to resolve those conflicts peacefully.
- When Jesus speaks of Himself as the true vine, we are reminded of His presence in the Eucharist. The Catholic Church 's theology of the Eucharist is rich and vast. Find the Catechism of the Polish National Catholic Church and see what it offers in its discussion of the Eucharist.
- Write cards of welcome and support to those in your faith community who became Polish National Catholic recently. Invite friends in your community to sign your cards or to write their own.

Questions

- Have you ever had the opportunity to speak out about your convictions in a context where it somehow put you or your reputation in jeopardy?
- Faithful people have argued in the past about the relative importance of believing and acting. Can you make a case for the importance and necessity of each?
- How does it feel to you to be a branch on the vine of Christ? What does the metaphor mean to you?

Activities

- Budget a certain amount of money you will set aside each day of the following week and decide on a charity to which you can donate it so your love will be manifest in deed as well as word.
- Talk to someone who gardens or has knowledge of agricultural practices. Ask him or her about the importance of pruning. Why

is it helpful and necessary? What happens to a plant that is not pruned?

Think of a time in your life when you needed someone to help and mentor you as Barnabas helped Saul. Reflect prayerfully on the benefits you derived, thank God for that person, and consider if you could do the same for someone else.


