WATER CONSERVATION MEASURES STAGE 2

Due to historic high demand levels from lack of rainfall, Mustang is implementing Stage 2 Drought Contingency measures effective immediately. This stage enacts <u>mandatory</u> watering restrictions to reduce demand. Failure to reduce demand at this point could potentially result in outages. We are asking all customers to take meaningful steps to reduce consumption. Currently, all systems, including both our own wells and the regional surface water provider, are operating at capacity flow demands around the clock. The result of this is that the storage tanks are not able to fill up and are gradually going down. If the current demand continues, the tanks risk running out of water resulting in outages.

Mandatory Stage 2 requirements:

Last address number is:

- ~ Even (0,2,4,6,8) may irrigate only on Sunday and Thursday
- ~ Odd (1,3,5,7,9) may irrigate only on Saturday and Wednesday.
- ~ NO outside irrigation is allowed on Monday, Tuesday, and Friday for any customer.
- \sim <u>NO</u> outside water use or irrigation is allowed between 10 am 6 pm.

We pledge to take every step possible to keep All Customers supplied with water. We ask you to please reduce any unnecessary water use and operate within the Stage requirements. Together we can keep everyone supplied this summer.

During a dry spell or a drought allow your lawn to grow to the upper range of the local recommendations of mowing heights for your turfgrass variety. Taller grass blades promote deeper roots and shade the soil, resulting in less water evaporation. IF YOU USE WATER WISELY YOUR LAWN WILL TOO! On an average, a lawn

irrigation, rainfall, or a combination of both.

Saturate root zones and let the soil dry.

Watering too much and too frequently results in shallow roots, weed growth, disease and fungus.

Berry Tarts

For the crusts:

2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour, plus more for dusting

3/4 cup pecans

6 tablespoons granulated sugar

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 1/2 sticks cold unsalted butter, cut into 1/2- inch

pieces

1 large egg, beaten

For the pastry cream:

1 cup whole milk

2/3 cup granulated sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/2 cup plus 3 tablespoons buttermilk

3 large egg yolks

3 tablespoons cornstarch

1 pint raspberries

1 pint blueberries

Confectioners' sugar, for dusting



Make the crusts: Pulse the flour, pecans, granulated sugar and salt in a food processor until the nuts are finely ground. Add the butter and pulse until the mixture looks like coarse meal. Drizzle in 6 tablespoons ice water and pulse until the dough comes together. Turn out onto a piece of plastic wrap and form into a disk; wrap and refrigerate until firm, about 1 hour. Lightly flour a large sheet of parchment paper. Roll out the dough on the parchment into a 9-by-13-inch rectangle. Trim into an 8-by-12-inch rectangle (reserve the scraps). Cut into eight 3-

by-4-inch rectangles. Separate the pieces slightly on the parchment, then use your fingers to crimp the edges. Slide the parchment onto a baking sheet. Roll out the scraps until 1/4 inch thick. Cut out 8 stars using a small floured star-shaped cookie cutter; arrange on the baking sheet around the crusts. Refrigerate until firm, about 20 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Poke holes in the crusts with a fork. Brush the stars and the edges of the crusts with the beaten egg. Bake until golden brown, about 25 minutes; remove to a rack to cool completely.

Make the pastry cream: Combine the milk, 1/3 cup granulated sugar and the vanilla in a saucepan and bring to a simmer over medium heat. Whisk 1/2 cup buttermilk, the egg yolks, cornstarch and the remaining 1/3 cup sugar in a bowl. Slowly pour the hot milk mixture into the egg mixture, whisking constantly. Pour the mixture back into the saucepan and cook, whisking, until thick and bubbling, about 3 minutes. Transfer to a bowl; stir in the remaining 3 tablespoons buttermilk. Lay plastic wrap on the surface and refrigerate 45 minutes.

Carefully transfer the crusts to a platter. Spread the pastry cream on the crusts, then top with the berries. Top each tart with a star. Dust with confectioners' sugar.

ARC & Compliance

If you are planning to do any construction/changes, not including interior, please be sure to reference the ARC Guidelines or Article VII of the D&C's on the Steeplechase HOA webpage and submit an ARC application prior to beginning. There have been several instances where homeowners have begun and not submitted an application for approval.

Except as expressly provided otherwise in this Declaration, no trailers, boats, boat trailers, mobile homes, motor homes, trucks or campers shall be permitted to park or be stored overnight on any street within the Property. All complaints for any violations with regard to a homeowner's property MUST be submitted via USPS or an email to the HOA.
