STATE OF THE STABLE

What a challenging year our 22nd year was. A BIG THANK YOU to everyone who has supported us by volunteering, making donations or bringing us riders and volunteers. We so appreciate all your support which has made Stable Influence Charity Programs the successful Equine Assisted Activities and Therapy program it is.

We welcomed 8 new riders to our family this year. All our riders made good progress toward their goals and those that achieved their goals got new ones to work toward. AHHH - it just gets better and better. We have improved the lives of over 463 riders since 1998. Some have been riding with us from the beginning. WOW !!

<u>Program</u> - For FY19 we started out with 17 half-hour riding lessons scheduled each week. This was up from 12 in FY18. We added a few riders and were up to 29 a week by Thanksgiving. Then, we lost entire weeks of classes due to heat, rain, strangles closing our Peoria site for 6 weeks and the biggy - Covid-19. By spring, we would have averaged 24 riders per week otherwise. This would have given us a big increase in riders had all the planets aligned in our favor. We started in September with 17 riders expecting to ride - and rain closed us down for our opening week. We then had rain several weeks through the beginning of December. The barn in Peoria had a strangles outbreak (horsie infection) which closed the barn through December and part of January and February. Fortunately, about ½ of our riders were able to come to New River where we were able to keep riding. In mid-February, just as things were opening up at the stables, Covid-19 happened and many of our riders and volunteers were unable to attend due to the restrictions. Stable Influence is considered an essential business and continued to offer classes to those who wanted to ride. We were - and still are - careful to have everyone sanitize their hands upon arrival, we sanitized high-touch surfaces and, of course, ask that you don't come if you are sick. Being outside with no indoor barn makes catching anything much less possible. We are unable to sanitize the horses, grooming supplies and riding tack, so are being diligent that everyone sanitize their hands once arriving at the barn.

With all the loss of riders through no fault, our costs per rider per 6-week session increased to \$622. More riders in the program will certainly change that number. Our costs to operate do not drop because we have less riders. We bill our riders a reduced fee and strive to bridge the difference with donations we receive. We had 3 sponsored riders this year, and 1 rider received a half-scholarship. We would have been in good shape with the number of riders wanting to ride and costs per rider would have dropped, but things didn't work out. I hope things will settle and for our costs per rider to drop this next year. As it stands now, I estimate we will need to fund raise about 55% of our rider costs to pay minimum operation expenses. Rider fees are calculated to pay for only the absolute essentials. With less riders than we need cause us to continue to fall short for New River horse boarding and Head Instructor salary. Riders are looking forward to getting started in the fall. So we are looking forward to a good beginning in September. We have riders who have been with us since before the beginning and we appreciate their continued support. We are always welcoming new riders. Some come and stay, but others are seeking a specific goal and once reached - it's time for them to "ride away". The Hudson's have supported 3 of our horses since April 2017 without full payment for board. Hay is purchased each summer. We received donations for the Lisa Wintermantel Memorial Ridership Award and hope we can help a few riders with partial class fees who could not ride otherwise. There are always a few riders needing sponsorship funding. So if you'd like to help a rider ride, contact us to make a donation. Donations for expenses are always appreciated. Funding for bareback pads, equipment repairs, vehicle maintenance and program tshirts, are not included in rider cost calculations and are totally dependent on donations. If we don't have the money, we cannot buy the equipment needed.

FY19 scheduled 634 half-hour riding lessons - which was 120 more than last year. We could have provided 1460 rides - about 2 times that, with adequate volunteer support. Due to all the challenges mentioned above, we could only provide 436 lessons. We made up 73 missed rides and had 47 no-shows. Weather was awful with 105 lost rides due to heat and rain. Then, we lost 135 rides, due to Covid-19, the strangles outbreak. That was riders who were participating. I know of at least 4 additional riders who wanted to participate but couldn't due to Covid-19 restrictions. So our lost rides numbers would be closer to 186. For summer, 2 riders participated in classes in June in Mesa only. This was the first time in 20 years we did not have New River riders for the summer. This was 7 less than last year total. I believe we'd have had at least 9 riders without the Covid-19 challenge. In August, we'll have 3 riders continue in Mesa providing the heat isn't too bad. Continuing education for our instructors and volunteers were partially paid for privately. Craig, thank goodness, continues to donate vehicle, shed and ramp maintenance. Our classes on Mondays at Royal Arabians in Mesa and Wednesdays at Soft Wind Riding Club in Peoria/Glendale will begin again mid-September. A day in New River may be opened as well. YEAH!

Volunteers:60 Registered volunteers with 15 helping out each week.1,659 Volunteers since 1998.3,164 hours of volunteer time were given this year.A 21-year total of 110,339.Volunteer hours.Horses gave 221 hours this year.22-year total of 9,859Horse hours by 58Horses since 1998.

Horses - In Mesa - We had sadness In December when we lost Indie. She suffered a torsion colic and was too old to survive a \$15,000 surgery. Stetson, 21, is still doing well. Indie's narrower barrel was just right for 2 of our Mesa riders who were

unable to ride once she was lost. We did receive a new horse, Afire Krewe. He is a 20 year old Arabian gelding who came from a dude ranch in New Mexico. He is just now beginning to help riders. He has been receiving a lot of necessary retraining to be ready. Thank you to Jay who has taken him on and is doing an amazing job. Afire started working with students the last Thursday of July and did a wonderful job with his little rider. Afire is just a smidge taller than Indie was and is also narrowly built. He offers more movement, which will be very nice for our riders. Stetson, with his wider barrel is great for riders needing to work their core. He is settling more and more each year. This year he was able to work with riders who had been riding Indie. Elaine Jay, Laura and Shelby help with conditioning our Mesa horses. Out in New River, our "baby", Dakota is now 19. Our riders who need her wide back and quiet movement do very well on her. Freckles is 26 now and is often my first choice for new riders. She is great for someone who need a quiet and somewhat narrow horse. Dakota and Liber-T certainly are not narrow. Liber-T is 27 and her bigger movement really helps riders needing to strengthen their core. Liber-T still insists on accuracy when ridden. This year she fell in love with a couple of our littlest riders and snuggles them whenever given a chance. I was pretty much on my own since Thanksgiving to maintain the New River horses. Alexis and Kim helped a bit. Horse board is a cost we have monthly no matter how many riders we have. The Equine Dentist is out in December and that will be about \$500 this year. We have 2 horses in Mesa and have 3 in New River. Thank you to the Morris family, The Outlander Private Foundation, Royal Arabians and the Hudson's for supporting our horses.

It's time for hay delivery and we are checking out costs this year. Hay prices are up a bit per bale. The board for New River horses covers hay and grain costs. The board cost for Mesa is for supplements and grain. Your hay/grain donation will allow us to purchase what we need.

You can help out with our Adopt a Horse program to support one of our amazing horses. Your donation of \$250/month or \$2,900 per year will support one of our horses. Come and ride. Your gift as well as your mileage can be tax deductible.

<u>Facebook and Twitter</u> - each week we post on Facebook and Twitter gets hit as well. "Like", follow and post to our Stable Influence Charity Programs page. Enjoy and share pictures of our riders' successes, as well as noting class changes. Also, just for grins and giggles, watch for sunsets, wild life and other fun stuff happening each week. Add a story, share with your friends, family and folks who may benefit from our services or who may want to help out. Spread the word - that's our best advertisement. If you ask your followers to donate, to sponsor a rider or horse, or just because, I bet some would. Donations can be given through Pay Pal Giving site by clicking the button on our web site. About 3% is taken out for fees. Or - just send us a check, which gives us your entire donation.

<u>Rider Stats</u>: When we could hold classes, we had a total of 24 riders participating in classes this year which was up from 17 last year. 6 - Autism, 3 - CP, 3 - AD(H)D, 2 - Down Syndrome, 2 - Fetal Alcohol Syndrom, 1 each Developmental Delay, Lennox Gausteau, Low Tone, Ohdo, Schizophrenia, Selective Mutism, Sensory Processing. Many of our riders have multiple challenges. Rider ages: 0-5 7, 6-10 5, 11-20 6, 21-30 4, 31+ 3.

We rode in 3 locations this year. On Monday and Thursday at Royal Arabians in Mesa. For Wednesdays in Glendale, our horses were trailered from New River each week during the school year. We also had riders in New River on Saturday mornings and some Wednesday afternoons where our riders enjoy fun on "real" trail rides. We ask all riders, volunteers and supporters to spread the word to potential riders and volunteers to help us increase participation. We had wonderful participation of volunteers this past year and are thankful to everyone who helped out. We so appreciate the support of our site owners - Maryann at Soft Wind Riding Club in Glendale, and the Hudsons in New River and Amanda at Royal Arabians in Mesa.

<u>Horse Show</u> - Unfortunately our horse show this year was canceled due to Covid-19. But, even though, we had donations of \$641 for our Ghost Horse Show. In lieu of showing, we had some special activities for our riders during their regular classes.

<u>Staffing</u> - Chris Hudson continues as the Head Riding Instructor and Executive Director. Barb Bell retired at the end of December - we certainly appreciate all the years she helped us out. Elaine, Jay, Laura and Shelby assist with horse care. Chris handles all the classes at all sites Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. Sundays are available to work horses and for volunteer lessons. Chris does the horse care in New River alone. Alexis and Kim have helped exercise horses in New River part of the year. Come play with our horses and improve your skills.

<u>Donations</u> - We, of course, thank all of you who donated this past year. We had new donors and supporters who help every year. Keep spreading the word and let us increase donors. We received donations from Phillip Cocklin, Julie Keahey Charitible Fund, Morris Family, The Outlander Private Foundation, Smith Family, Boeing ECF, Denise Stiglish and the Lisa Wintermantel Memorial Ridership Award, to name a few. Of course, we always need to keep finding new donors. Thank you to ALL listed in our Donation Section - we truly appreciate your generous gifts.

A group effort by riders, families, volunteers and staff is necessary to keep riders riding. Our supporters, that includes all of you, help us find new sources of funding to bring donations in. Keep spreading our story to find new donors.

The challenges our riders have require extra financing just for day-to-day living. Insurance and government programs do not support Equine Assisted Activities. Our riders receive so much benefit, their families struggle to pay for them to ride. Those that rode this past year were very grateful we were able to stay open as so many things have been shut down. I believe that is why each year new riders come to us and previous riders return We have riders who have been with us for over 20 years It works, and most riders see improvements the very first ride.

<u>Fundraising</u> - Our horse show is our big fundraiser each year. Other ideas could be - a wine tasting or a painting party. Who can set up a simple fundraiser? Got "Spare Change" - we'll take it. A scholarship fundraiser would be good to support the riders on scholarships. Several riders are requesting funding assistance. Little events like a dinner for friends, a t-shirt raffle, a car wash and the continued support of regular donors are appreciated and allow us to keep doing.

Usual fundraising and donations were around \$14,408 - this was a decrease of about \$4,692 from last year. We continue to work to get donations up. Fundraising is a critical need in all non-profits. Some grant writing was done in the past and if someone would like to tackle it - thanks. Insurance and repair expenses were up. Other expenses remained pretty stable.

Our "Poop Bucket Challenge" - asking for a \$10 donation is still out there. Ask your friends and family to help us fill a poop bucket with \$10 bills to support our horses. If can then encourage 5 friends to join in and they ask 5 friends - - - . We would have all we need to support our horses. Donate through our Pay Pal Giving account or better yet, send your Horse Care gift directly to us and let's fill our bucket up. Eight years ago we started the 100 for \$100 campaign. It's still out there - unfinished but getting closer. Let's finish this campaign by each one of you finding just ONE person to gift us \$100. They're waiting to be asked.

Craig and I have personally covered the costs for the New River horses the past 3 years. Donations from The Outlander Private Foundation, Hudson Family and Morris Family and Royal Arabians helped with horse care this year.

Ask people you know to support us with only \$10 a year - or better yet \$10 every month. Although it doesn't sound like much, I bet we could bridge our costs if everyone plays a part and makes it happen. What do the big foundations say? "For only \$.33 a day !!!" That's only 2 Starbuck's coffees or a pizza in a week. AND if everyone found just one person or company to donate \$100, we would meet our campaign goal. Your request gets us in that door. Often folks ONLY NEED TO BE ASKED. Donations have come from various companies simply because their employees asked. Does your company offer funding or grants? You don't know if you don't ask.

Our fundraising needs each year are: Insurance \$1,200, PATH Membership \$650, Continuing Education for our instructors, \$500, our 5 horses require board, feed, vet and hoof trimming to the tune of around \$18,000. Our instructors work more than their small salaries give for their time. Their compensation has not increased since 2000. I personally put over 70 hours a week into the program with teaching, office administration, fund raising and horse care. Office and utility expenses never go away. Our Suburban is a 1986 with over 500,000 miles and our 2001 Elantra just turned over 295,000

miles. We have to plan for newer vehicles sometime in the not too distance future. We've been using Hudson's personal dually pick-up truck for classes because having the pick-up bed currently makes more sense. Craig continues to donate time to keep everything running well. Thank you to Alexis, Elaine, Jay, Kelli, Kim, Laura and Shelby for helping with the horses.

Afire's Gluten-Free Blonde Brownies

2/3 C	Rice Flour	1 t	Salt		2 C	Brown Sugar	2 t	Vanilla
2/3 C	Tapioca Flour	1 t	Baking Powder	2	Eggs			
2/3 C	Corn Starch	1/4 t	Baking Soda		2/3 C	Coconut Oil		

If you like, add ½ C walnuts and/or peanut butter chips, and/or butterscotch chips.

- Grease a 13x9" pan (may want to line a glass pan with foil). Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.

- Mix together flours, cornstarch, salt, baking powder and baking soda in a small bowl.
- Mix together remaining ingredients in a larger bowl, then stir in the dry ingredients.

- Spread batter into pan and bake for 25-30 minutes, or until golden brown and done in the center.

- Cool and cut into squares
