We have a 1930 Model A 5 Window Coupe chopped 3 inches with a 354 Hemi truck engine block. I put 331 heads on it with a 671 blower and two 650 Holley carbs. It has a trans adaptor with a 400 automatic transmission with a shift kit. 1932 radiator set up like a flathead 8 so it would work with a big block chevy, water pump and room for the drive belt. It also has a Dana 60 shortened with 410 gears. It has a 1956 truck dash cut to fit. My son, Scott was about 5 years old when I was building the car, he is now 40 years old. Good memories, still not done! License plate says it all "NASTY A". Thanks for voting for it, Vic and Danna .



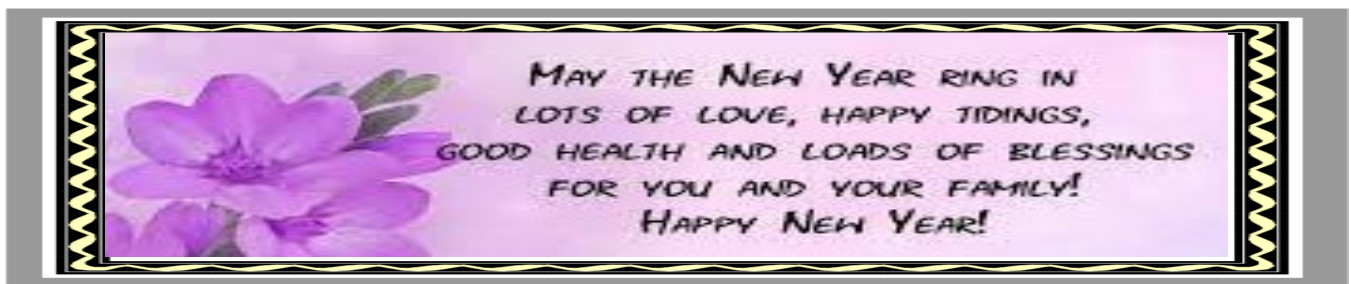

Thanks to the help and support of our treasurer Bob, we made a successful switch to Edward Jones, and have been assured by them we can have access to our funds when needed without large penalties. Also, we now have a representative from them that will come to our meetings and give us up-dates during the year. Expect one of those up-dates at our February general meeting. An issue we had noticed by people outside of our club was the need to up-grade our club website. Dennis Arntson and myself had started discussing this with Dave Dickson in 2021 and had made a few small changes. This year, we decided to move forward with a complete re-vamping and restructuring of the web site. Dave Dickson did not feel comfortable with this process and so withdrew from his role as webmaster and Betty Schmitt came forward to fill Dave's spot and has done a great job of re-vamping our site to a more current design and is continuing to make up-grades and additions. My final comment for the month is please consider filling our Sargent at Arms position, it is the final vacancy on our 2023 board and we would really like to start the year with a complete board. Also note that at our December board meeting we discussed the issue of written ballots for the club elections. The decision of the board was since everyone was unopposed, written ballots would not be required, and we would forgo the added expense of them this year. Thanks to all of the support you have given me, helping make my term as president very enjoyable. I'm looking forward to moving into my next role as the 2023 Car Show Chair, and as you probably know by now, I plan to tweak some things to make our show appealing to more/different people beyond our normal attendees. Meet "Little Mac"

I want to introduce you to "Little Mac". It started as a brainstorm when I couldn't really accurately control the 3 point blade behind my tractor and about that time I saw a miniature road grader in a Farm Show magazine and I thought that is what I need.

I already had a 3 point blade to start with. I looked at a couple of skid-steers, but decided against them. Following a lead on a ditch witch, I thought I could make that work. Purchased the ditch witch in September of '21 and then made numerous trips to Gottwalt Implement and figuring what would work and kept bringing things home.

This grader was made from scratch and is more than 90% recycled parts! I did not have a blue print but just kept going from part to part, After some mistakes and trial and error and redoing we finally started it up in September of '22 and it worked!!

Am taking some bugs out to make it do a more realistic job. I had 12 years experience grading roads in our township to know what works and what the result should be.

I like to have projects to work on and this has been a good one to keep me "busy", and besides a lot less money than another car. Thanks for letting me share with you. Les Adelman

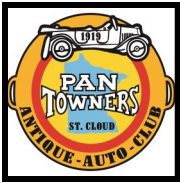
