The settlement also involves medical monitoring, which already is under way.

The plaintiffs had alleged pollution of carcinogens zinc, cad-

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mium, arsenic and lead from the old smelter site.

The case went to trial and saw a hefty award to the plain-The ceremonial first earth tiffs, However, it was whittled down by a Supreme Court rul-ing, and, as DuPont continued to litigate a settlement was reached that nixed any punitive award.
