Entry fees: Team of 4 riders @ £20 per rider / individuals @ £20 per class

OBRC entry fees and entries important information

All BRC Area 6 competition qualifiers have two sets of entry fees.

First part: Pre-entry paid to the BRC office.

Second part: Main entry fee paid to the RC organising the Jumping competition.
The costs have got up & the club finances can't continue to support the extra fees.
The committee's decision is the Old Berkeley riding club will offer to pay:
One BRC pre-entry fee @ £12.50 per club member for this competition.

Main entry fee includes paramedic fees

Team member entry and individual entry fees are £20 per rider per class.

**If a member wants to enter a second class they will need to pay the
BRC pre- entry fee @ £12.50 and main entry @ £20 = £32.50.**

Please read through the whole schedule carefully including the rules on
eligibilities, your horse's flu vaccinations, body protectors and riding hats.

Details of heights and eligibility rules for horses & riders in each class.

The qualifiers consist of both teams & individuals for all height levels.

Senior 70cm: First round 70cm / second round: 75cm.

Horses / ponies eligibility – Not to have any BS pts (BS club pts at 90cm or higher).
Horses may not have completed a BRC or BE 100cm or above in the current or
previous year. Or No BE points or BE foundation points.

Senior 80cm Novice: First round 80cm / second round: 85cm.

Horse / pony eligibility - not to have won 75 BS points and no more than
5 BE points. Horses maybe currently registered with BE but must not have completed
BE 105 or above in current or previous calendar year.

Senior 90cm: First round 90cms / second round: 95cms.

Horse / pony eligibility – not to have won more than 500 BS notional points and no
more than 20 BE points.

Senior & Junior mixed First round: 100cm / second round: 1.05cm.

Horse / pony eligibility - not to have won more than 999 BS notional points and no
more than 60 BE points.

Senior & Junior mixed first round 1.05cm / second round- 110cm.

Horse / pony eligibility unlimited BS and BE points.

Volunteer helpers

**OBRC will need to provide one non competing helper per team or 4 individuals
at this competition.**

Important information about the SJ competition

** All OBRC members who are interested in being part of a team or competing as individual in any of the classes must be **a members by Wednesday 1st May**

Format for all classes in this Area 6 qualifier Jumping classes:

The jumping order will be all team riders jumping one after another, this help with team spirit & allows riders to watch each other on the day.

All class heights will be run under –SINGLE PHASE – this will be a longer track in the arena and timed throughout the whole course.

The jumping rounds will be in the large outdoor arena with warm up in the top outdoors, both on surfaces.

Extra rules:

Horse & rider combinations can enter more than one class as a team member or an individual, but not more than two classes. Horses can only enter a max of two class 70cm + 80cm / 80cm + 90cm / 90cm + 100cm /100cm +1.05cm.

** The 70cm class is the first class of the day – early start.

BRC Area 6 rules for this show Jumping competition.

All the classes are open to teams of 4 senior to jump with the best three scores over the total round to count. These classes are also open to individuals.

Numbers should be printed by competitors and worn in number bibs please.

Full rules and eligibilities for both horse and riders can be found in the BRC website see Handbook 2024.

Body protectors – new rules for 2024.

From January 1st 2024 the BETA 2009 Purple Label will no longer be accepted.

The exception to this requirement is that the EXO Body cages will continue to be accepted, provided they have a BETA Level 3 Purple 2000 Label.

If a rider chooses to wear an airbag style body protector for X-C or SJ it must be worn over a permitted BETA Level 3 body protector.

Hybrid Air –Jackets and air jackets incorporated into a blouson style jacket are permitted.

For show Jumping – whips.

One whip is permitted and must be between 45cm – 75cm and must not be weighted or feature a hard point at the end. The end if the whip must be padded.

Rules on the Flu Vaccinations for 2024

Your horse must have up to date influenza vaccinations in line with rule G7.4: in the current 2024 BRC Handbook page 24.

Please read rules on page 24 eligibility for competing & Flu vaccination updated rules in the BRC Handbook which can be found on the website; www.bhs.org.uk/enjoy-riding/british-riding-clubs/brc-handbook or just google: British Riding Clubs Rules 2024. Scroll down to Handbook.

In order to compete a horse must be vaccinated in accordance with the above BRC rules and MUST also have had a vaccination within 12 calendar months (but not in any of the 6 preceding days) of the competition and / or entry to competition stables.

Horses may compete providing that they have had the first two primary injections **providing the second vaccination (but not in any of the 6 preceding days) of the competition and / or entry to competition stables.**

In the event of failure to comply with any of the requirements of the Flu vaccination rules, the horse or pony will be disqualified and not permitted to take part in any competition to which these rules apply.

It is compulsory for all horses to be microchipped.

Please check your passports carefully and make sure that your horses / ponies vaccinations are kept up to date throughout the year.

Protective Headwear Rules.

BRC have updated their rules on riding / competition hats for 2024.

All riding / competition hats worn at Area qualifying competitions will need to be re-tagged with the new **PINK tag.**

Hats that meet one of the following standards.

British: PAS 015 2011 with BSI Kitemark or Inspec IC mark

New standard BS EN 1384 (2023) when this comes on the market – will be accepted.

European: VG1 01.040: 2014-12 with BSI Kitemark or Inspec IC mark

American: ASTM F1163: 2004a or 04a onwards with SEI mark. Also SNELL E2016 Australian & NZ: AS/NZS 3838: 2006 onwards with SAI global mark.

From 1st January 2023 the PAS 015: 1998 and SNELL E2001 will no longer be accepted.

** If you need to get a **PINK Tag** on your hat, this can be checked & tagged at the secretary's office by the indoor school before you compete on the competition day.
