

# Critter Corner: Blackburnian Warbler



This first-year immature male has similar coloration to an adult female. During the next breeding season, he will develop an orange throat and forehead spot, darker black patches on the back and shoulders, and a larger white patch on the wings.

Blackburnian warblers live in conifer forests and oak-hickory woodlands in southeast Canada and northeast USA. They migrate south through the eastern USA, eastern Mexico, and Central America to northern South America.

Birds are usually found high in trees, even during migration. They are usually hard to spot through the heavy foliage unless given away by their high-pitched song. Sometimes they can be seen foraging for insects or catepillars near the end of branches.
