2023 Assure End of the Year Report

Outreach:

Assisted one individual and 3 families with suicide related expenses and counseling expenses.

Began partnership with Wright State University (WSU) Lake Campus Psychology Club and Psychology Professor to develop presentation on Mental Health and Suicide. Presentations have been done by students to at least 4 local organizations and continue to schedule in 2024.

Assure participated on panel for mental health week to discuss suicide and suicide related topics and answer student questions. Panel included mental health professionals, survivors, and other community groups.
