FROM THE DESK OF MAYOR ELLEN

Happy Spring Everyone,

Many things going on these days in our beautiful village. Roads are being repaired by Al Hayes and Rod. They are looking for strong backs to help with some of the heavy stuff. Call Karen if you are available and willing, I thank you in advance.

The beach will be open for food at the concession stand for three weekends and then the opening for the Memorial Day holiday. The swim lake will be up and running for the holiday and until June 11th. At the June's council meeting we will see if the income from food sales and admission of \$2 is enough to sustain the beach for another month. We are going month by month to see if it is sustainable in our current fiscal mode. Joan and Jackie Grant are the go to people to offer help for the running of the beach and concession. Any volunteer help will be much appreciated as it will save money to go toward operational cost for June. This is a huge job and Joan has shouldered much of the burden. If you want the beach to stay open please help any way you can especially by eating all those pizzas and sandwiches. We are opening the beach with the donations from our generous citizens in response to my plea for financial help. As of this week we have received \$1200. This is not a sustainable way to operate the beach on a regular basis but it has allowed it to open at least for a time this year. We are checking other avenues of operation.

Bob Tuco is heading a team of people to treat the lakes on a limited level to conserve the chemicals we already have and not destroy the plankton the little fish need to grow. This weekend, May 5th and 6th, are the target dates. Anyone interested in helping should contact Karen or Bob. Karen is our volunteer coordinator. Fish and Lakes discussed the stocking of the lakes and it has been determined that the best time for us to do this for fiscal reasons will be in September or October. I know this is disappointing but it is the best decision for the current climate. My hope is that in the fall we can afford to add a substantial amount of fish.

I have a sewer meeting this week with the Health Department, the EPA and Access to make sure our timeline follows EPA and Health Department mandates. I will report on this at the May meeting,

It is very encouraging to see all the people in attendance at the council meetings. Hopefully it assures residents of our good faith in attempting to run the village in a responsible way. We have a good and dedicated council. Please be encouraging to them. We are also slowly building a team of wonderful volunteers and more offers every day. It is especially good to hear from young people as our population of working volunteers is aging and we need the energy and technical savvy of the younger generation. It is time to pass on all this wisdom and knowledge. Thanks to all who are willing to get involved.

Speaking of which, Angie Wicker is coordinating the **"Shop the Lakes" event this Saturday, May 5th, at the clubhouse.** Come out and shop and then stop down at the Beach and grab a sandwich. While you're there pick up a broom or a rake or a shovel and help us get the beach cleaned up for the holiday opening.

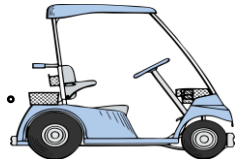

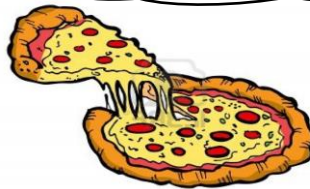
