# Wayne Lakes Beach

#### The Evolution of the Wayne Lakes Beach

In the past year, there have been many additions and improvements to the beach concession stand. When we enclosed the back hallway to make more room to handle additional people we were no longer "grandfathered in" and were required to bring the building and equipment up to today's codes.

With the addition of the Marianne Butch observation deck 2 years ago, we started to make the beach more handicap friendly. The entry was widened, and a ramp built to accommodate wheelchairs. Both bathrooms will be wheelchair accessible before the 4th of July.

Mayor Gary's vision for the Wayne Lakes Beach was extensive. He wanted to offer sandwiches, pizza, tenderloins and onion rings and fries in addition to pizza and cold treats. Eventually he hoped it would become a 3-season snack bar for all villagers, not just swimmers, to enjoy the food and fellowship.

In order to do this, he wrote several grants and took out a loan, met with dozens of contractors and inspectors. We had hoped to be completed by Memorial Day, now we are hoping for a 4 th of July completion date.

Here is a list of improvements:

- New lake water pump for the slide and dock fountain
- New foot wash and drinking fountain
- In the bathrooms, all new privacy wall with wide doorways and new doors. New showers and fixtures all new plumbing and venting for the kitchen equipment.
- In the kitchen new, upgraded commercial appliances with the required sinks and grease traps.
- Many necessary repairs and a new metal roof.

So much of this was accomplished by blood, sweat and tears, sheer determination and a desire to make sure the next generation can continue to enjoy our beautiful village.

Special thanks, in addition to Mayor Gary for his leadership and countless hours planning and construction. Thanks to Mike Bland for roofing and plumbing, Rod McNutt for just about everything mechanical or growing, Cindy Hale for landscaping, Joe Shumaker for running the golf cart fundraiser and licensing, Karen and Ted Sink for emptying lots of trash cans throughout the village and taking over the newsletter. Rita Robinette for taking on the responsibility of zoning and ordinances, and Tammy Barger and more recently, Dee Howell for managing all the grants, bills and deadlines, John McRoberts for keeping us all together and on track. And me, I am the one who takes all the aluminum cans to the recycling center and help with the Beach.


