AKC TRICK-DOG

The world as we know it has changed, it has changed in a way that we have never seen before. Our lives have changed which has caused our habits to change, which in turn has affected our language and hobbies. Prior to COVID-19 I thought "Social Distancing" was making sure there was adequate room between your dog and others at a show and I thought "Self-Quarantining" was what you did when you imported a dog from certain countries, or what you did if you lost big at a dog show, HaHaHa. With everything around us changing I can tell you that there is one thing that will definitely not waver during these trying times, the unconditional love and desire to please us that our Belgians provide. In the midst of tragedy, it is absolutely amazing to me to see just how steadfast our wonderful dogs are.

In an attempt to raise morale in dog sports, the AKC has opened up the Trick Dog Titles to video evaluation. I received the following guidelines from AKC last week: "While dog owners are staying at home practicing social distancing and dog trainers are suffering a loss of business, the AKC Family Dog Program is pleased to announce that dog owners may teach their dogs tricks at home and submit a video to an AKC CGC Evaluator for review and approval. This applies to all levels of AKC Trick Dog training. AKC Trick Dog resources can be found here

How It Works:

- 1) Dog owners teach trick to their dogs at home
- 2) When the dog has learned the tricks for the title, the dog owner sends a video of the dog performing the tricks to an AKC CGC Evaluator.
- 3) The Evaluator reviews the video. Any fee arrangements for the Evaluator's time are between the Evaluator and the dog owner.
- 4) Once the Evaluator reviews and approves the video, the Evaluator sends a copy of the Video Verification form: a) to the DOG OWNER confirming that the dog passed the test, and b) to AKC at trickdog@akc.org

AKC TRICK-DOG, Continued

Then, to apply for the title, the DOG OWNER must send to AKC:

- 1) a copy of the VIDEO VERIFICATION form from the Evaluator (the Evaluator will also send a copy to AKC)
- 2) the Trick Dog Title Application (along with the fee that AKC requires, at this time it is \$20 but that may change), and
 - 3) TRICKS CHECKLIST (for each title level submitted)."

I am very excited to say that I am an AKC Trick Dog Evaluator and I am very willing to evaluate your videos for your titles. I am charging \$20 per dog and I will donate 50% of all proceeds to the Take the Lead Organization. For those of you who are not familiar with Take the Lead, "Take the Lead provides direct services, support and care for people in the sport of purebred dogs who suffer the devastation of life-threatening or terminal illness. Perhaps no one can describe who we are and what we do better than someone we have helped along the way."

2020 OFA TERV HEALTH SURVEY

The American Belgian Tervuren Club of America (ABTC) Health Education Committee (HEC) surveys owners of Belgian Tervuren to help identify the significant health concerns in the Belgian Tervuren and collect general information. The most recent survey was done in 2014. In 2019, the HEC began setting up a new survey. After alpha and beta testing, the survey is now ready for distribution and collection of data. The ABTC expresses sincere gratitude to the OFA for hosting the survey. The results of this survey will assist the ABTC in determining the overall health picture of Tervuren and will enable us to make better decisions about where to focus our educational efforts and our research support.

Please fill out this survey for each Tervuren you have owned since 2014, living or dead, healthy or with health issues. Complete one survey for each dog. At the end of each survey click Finish and then, if reporting more than one dog, simply take the survey again. Each survey should take you about five minutes to complete.

Personal and pedigree information is NOT part of this survey and is not needed in any way to complete the survey. Information submitted is not identifiable by the OFA, the ABTC parent club, or the ABTC Health Education Committee.

On questions that ask about health, please be careful to enter a VETERINARIANS DIAGNOSIS from your pet's health records if the health condition requires that. If a diagnosis was not determined by your veterinarian or cannot be made, please do not list it for your dog. For other health concerns, or those in which a veterinarians diagnosis is not available, feel free to select "Other" at the end of the health questions and then describe the health problem in the box provided.

This survey is not limited to ABTC members. Please pass the word to encourage ALL Tervuren owners and breeders to fill out this survey.
