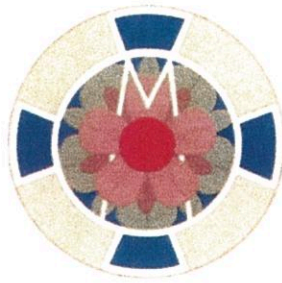

What's Yours Is Mine

Despite the experiences of life, God does treat us the same. Unfortunately, we will not completely realize this equality until we celebrate eternal life in the Kingdom

FIRST READING The prophet Isaiah wrote words of encouragement in a time of threat. Jerusalem, the holy mount of the Lord, would be a place of peace and equality. The city would be a space for mutual respect and mutual worship.

PSALM Psalm 23 is one of the most beloved psalms in the Bible. It is a song of God's care even in the darkest of times and toughest of journeys.

SECOND READING In his letter to the Philippians, St. Paul held himself to the community as an example of Christian living. He pointed to God's constant care in his experience of the ups and downs of life.

GOSPEL In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus told the parable of the king's wedding feast of his son. The invited nobles refused to attend, so the king invited the commoners. We might miss the import of the story. As an allegory of the Kingdom, the parable proclaimed all are invited and all are equal in the eyes of God the King.

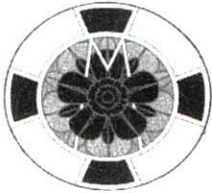

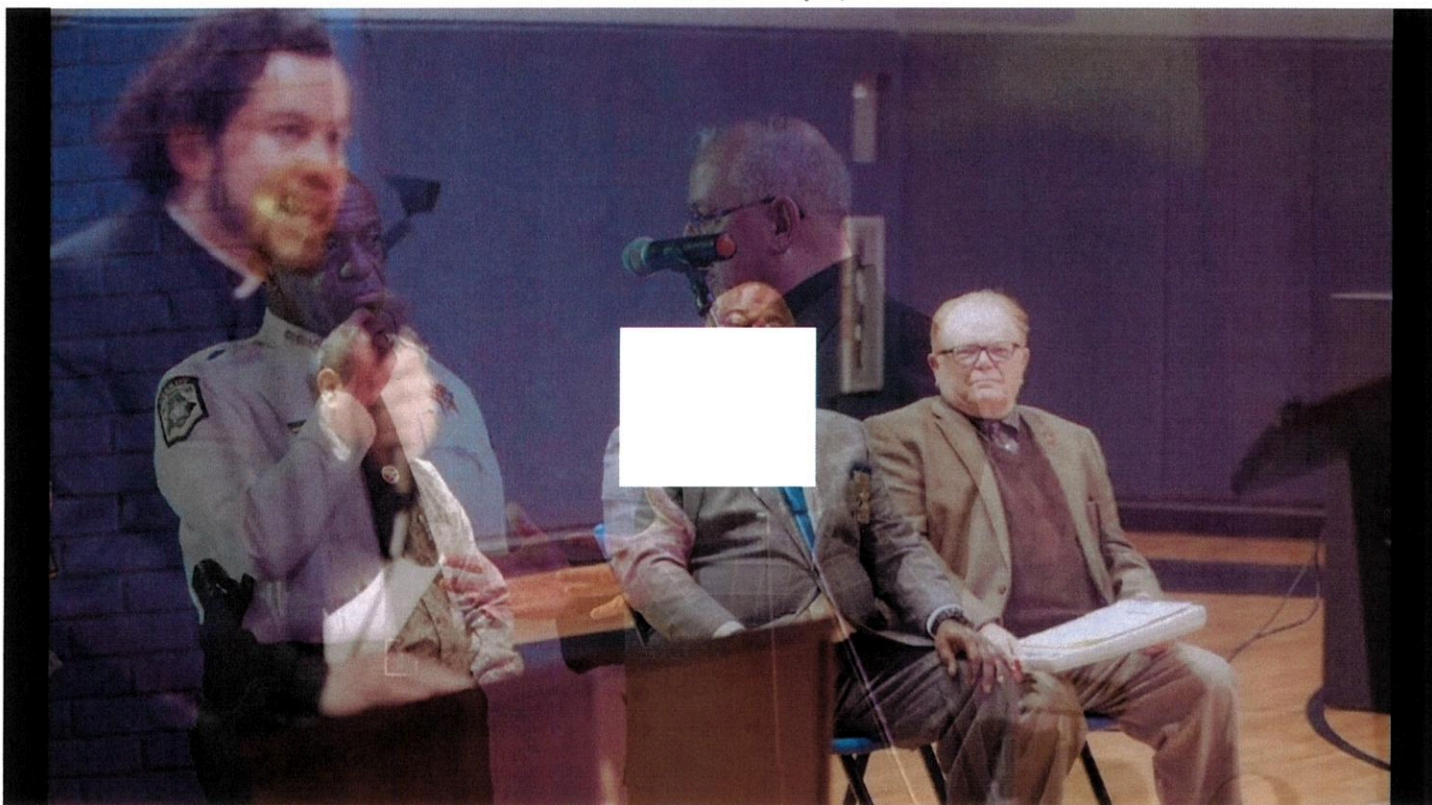
CCHD: Working on the Margins
