Qualifications

This scholarship is open to male and female athletes who attend and graduate from an Oklahoma Public school and participated in a recognized OSSAA sports program for at least two (2) years. The student must attend a college or university full-time at an Oklahoma accredited institution. Preference is given to but not limited to African American students. The scholarship monies are contingent upon monies available each year and may vary. Recipients will be notified in writing or phone call on or before May 1st this year. In addition, each recipient will receive an invitation to attend the Oklahoma African American Educators Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony banquet on September 27, 2024 at the Grand Casino Event Center in Shawnee, Oklahoma.

Value of the Award

One (1) 1,000.00 scholarship will be awarded per student awarded the second semester of the Freshman year.

Scholarships are awarded contingent upon maintaining a minimum of 2.0 GPA for the fall semester of the recipients incoming freshmen year of college (immediately following graduation from high school) and completion of 12 hours during that same fall semester at an accredited institution in the state of Oklahoma (verified by college or university registrar enrolled).
