Power of Dreams and Visions

Dreams are an important aspect of the Bible, and many Christians believe that God can speak to us through them.

Early Church Fathers

Jacob's dream of the ladder

Jacob's dream of the ladder:

In Genesis 28, Jacob has a dream in which he sees a ladder reaching up to heaven. Angels are ascending and descending on the ladder, and God speaks to Jacob from above the ladder. This dream is a sign of God's covenant with Jacob and his descendants.



- Gideon dreams of a fleece (Judges 6:11-14)
- Manoah dreams of an angel (Judges 13:3-9)
- Samuel dreams that God is calling him (1 Samuel 3:1-10)
- David dreams that God has forgiven him (2 Samuel 12:13)

- In Daniel 2, Daniel interprets a dream that King Nebuchadnezzar has had. The dream is a prophecy of the rise and fall of four kingdoms. Daniel also interprets a dream that Nebuchadnezzar has had about a statue made of different materials. The dream is a prophecy of the coming of the Messiah.





Joseph and Mary

- Joseph, the husband of Mary, dreams that an angel tells him not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife (Matthew 1:18-25)
- Joseph, the husband of Mary, dreams that an angel tells him to flee to Egypt with Mary and Jesus (Matthew 2:13-15)

Dreams and visions were a common way for God to communicate with people in the Bible. They were often used to reveal God's plan for the future, to give guidance, or to warn people of danger.




Habakkuk

- 3. Prophetic Dreams: These dreams reveal future events or situations.
- 4. Processing Dreams: These dreams help us process and deal with emotions or experiences from our waking lives.
- 5. Healing Dreams: These dreams offer physical or emotional healing.
- 5. Teaching Dreams: These dreams provide us with insight or understanding about a particular topic or situation.
- 7. Calling Dreams: These dreams reveal our life's purpose or calling.

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
Inventions You Won't Believe Were Inspired By Dreams

The 19th century American engineer, Elias Howe, got his idea for the world's first automatic sewing machine from a dream. He had been trying to design a lock-stitch machine and his attempts had been unsuccessful. Perplexed about why this was so, he went to sleep troubled and had a nightmare about being attacked by tribal men with spears. As each spear was thrown at him, he noticed they had eye shaped holes in the tip. He realized his error. He had placed the hole in the middle of the automatic needle. Also, he changed the design to mirror that of his dream and placed the hole at the tip instead.

He patented his design for the <u>lock-stitch sewing machine</u> on the 10th September 1846, two years after his dream.








• Friedrich August Kekule, a German chemist, is responsible for the discovery of the Benzene ring. It is a chemical structure that is used in the preservation of gasoline and is vital to the petrochemical industry.

The Periodic Table

Dimitri Mendeleev, a Russian chemist, who reportedly obtained the idea for the table from a dream. He had been writing a text and attempting to classify all the elements, but was struggling to do so. After three days and nights working at his desk with no sleep, he gave up and allowed himself to rest. As soon as he slumbered, the answers became clear. He was quoted as saying

"I saw in a dream, a table where all elements fell into place as required. Awakening, I immediately wrote it down on a piece of paper, only in one place did a correction later seem necessary."



Lorenzo's Oil

The treatment, named <u>Lorenzo's Oil</u> after Lorenzo Odone, was found to be effective at preventing the disease in children who had not yet developed symptoms, although it had mixed results for children already showing signs of the disease. Many symptomatic patients still died. However, Lorenzo himself exceeded expectations and lived until the day after his 30th birthday, a situation previously unheard of for ALD patients.

Lorenzo's father fell asleep. He had a dream of his son, tugging at both sets of paperclips, which were one. He realized that both types of fat were from the same enzyme and that this fat could be destroyed by oleic acid. From this dream he was able to formulate a treatment extracted from olive oil and rapeseed oil.



Insulin as a Treatment for Diabetes


In 1920, Dr Frederick Banting, a surgeon, hit upon the idea that digestive juices could damage the islets of Langerhans and if he stopped their flow, the cells could be preserved and extracted, to be used as a treatment for diabetes.

The idea came to him in a dream and when he woke up at 2 am on October 31, 1920, he penned down a few words that would lead to a treatment. When the cells were successfully extracted, he injected them into diabetic dogs, who became symptom free. He named the treatment 'Isletin'. A coworker later suggested the name Insulin.



The Theory of Relativity

There's much debate about whether the inspiration for Albert Einstein's most famous theory - the mind-boggling intellectual area of Relativity - came to him in a dream, so much so that an entire work of fiction was created in 1992 by author Alan Lightman entitled *Einstein's Dreams*. Legend has it that Einstein dreamed one time that he was sledding down a mountainside at an enormous speed, which caused the stars to change their appearance.



The Double Helix structure of DNA


James Watson, who together with Francis Crick, discovered the double helix structure of DNA - the building blocks of life - seemingly dreamed of a spiral staircase, ultimately planting the seed of an idea for how DNA might be constructed





The Scientific Method

René Descartes helped established the framework for scientific method's guiding principles in his treatise, Discourse on the Method for Guiding One's Reason and Searching for Truth in the Sciences, published in 1637, crystallising the modern scientific method which, of course, led to all the great discoveries and advancements that followed. But he would not have written it at all had he not dreamt one night - during a stint in the army - of a new project for his life: to rejecting everything he had been taught was true, and building it back up on an arguable, firm foundation.



Srinivasa Ramanujan

Mathematician of Genius

"While asleep, I had an unusual experience. There was a red screen formed by flowing blood, as it were. I was observing it. Suddenly a hand began to write on the screen. I became all attention. That hand wrote a number of elliptic integrals. They stuck to my mind. As soon as I woke up, I committed them to writing."

"... each of the 24 modes in the Ramanujan function corresponds to a physical vibration of a string. Whenever the string executes its complex motions in space-time by splitting and recombining, a large number of highly sophisticated mathematical identities must be satisfied. These are precisely the mathematical identities discovered by Ramanujan."

Phil Mason, Spiritual Director of New Earth Tribe in Byron Bay, Australia, elucidates the spirit/quantum connection in his excellent work Quantum Glory. He teaches that God is the Ultimate Observer and that because He sees all, everything exists.1 Every possibility is present in the spiritual realm, but God wants us to co-create with Him and bring what exists in Heaven to earth. He has already made it available and authorized it; we just need to co-sign His check.

Once we match the dream's action and feeling with the corresponding action and feeling in waking life, we understand to which area of our life the dream is speaking.

Dreams, like Holy Spirit Himself, reveal but do not condemn.

Dreams amplify and exaggerate to get our attention. If we ignore a dream's message it will reoccur, often more dramatically (i.e., in a nightmare).




