When I was young, parents disciplined children with a paddle, a switch, or their hands. But now they call that "child abuse." Today they say if children are allowed to do as they please, they will turn out good. Apparently Solomon didn't know what he was talking about when he said, "He who spares the rod hates his son," Prov. 13:24. I thought he got his information from God. Oh, well...we have psychiatrists to help us understand life in these later times.

Romans 12:2 is very sincere in the instructions Paul gives to the Romans, "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect." If our "New Year" is to be truly new, we have to do some transforming and renewing.

The word renewing or renewal here is an action noun describing a continuing renewal. In 2 Corinthians 4:16 it says, 'Therefore we do not lose heart, but though our outer man is decaying, yet our inner man is being renewed day by day." It takes determination and action daily. There is no magic fairy dust on January 1st that causes us to have a new life physically or spiritually. But we also have to realize that if we don't change some things in our life then nothing changes.

Where is God in all of this newness? Maybe we can gain great encouragement by listening to David as he confesses to God after he sinned with Bathsheba. Psalm 51: 10 "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. How can God do that? By you surrendering your life to Him totally. You will not change your life by yourself. I AM THE WAY, THE TRUTH AND THE LIFE Sermon by Denny

TEXT: John 14:5-6

INTRO: There are many things about Christianity that offends some people, but the chief offense is it's Founder, Jesus Christ. He offended those of the first century by His claims, and He does the same today. That's why when religion is excluded from schools, colleges and public events. It's usually only Christianity that is excluded. Some try to lump all beliefs together in the hopes that it will reduce the statements Jesus made about Himself. Ever wonder why that is? There are at least five reasons and one invitation.

I. <u>EXCLUSIVENESS OF HIS STATEMENTS</u>

A. THE OFFENSE OF BEING ONE WAY

Jesus sates His supreme authority over all things.

- 1. "I am the bread of life," John 6:36
- 2. "I am the light of the world," John 8:12, 9:5
- 3. "I am the door," John 10:7, 9
- 4. "I am the Good Shepherd." John 10:11, 14
- 5. "I am the resurrection and the life, John 11:25

B. THE DEFINATE ARTICLE

- 1. He said "the" as in only not "a"
- Exclusiveness of others should not be offensive
- 3. He's the only One who can bring us:
 - Communion with God the Father.
 - b. The truth from the Father.
 - c. Salvation and a spiritual life
 - "The" is limiting and offends the arrogant.

II. <u>IT'S ALL JESUS</u>

That is the point we can't miss. He meets us at all levels

A. FOUR QUESTIONS ASKED OF HIM

- 1. Where are you going, Peter in John 13:36.
- 2. How can we know, Thomas in John 14:5
- 3. Show us the Father, Philip in John 14:8
- 4. Why show us and not the world, Jude, John 14:22

- To Peter Later you'll understand, follow Me.
- 2. To Thomas I am the way.
- 3. To Philip If you see me you've seen the Father.
- 4. To Jude The Spirit will dwell in you later' In all of these He is showing that all things are in Him.

CONCLUSIONS: Jesus died making "The way." He told "The truth" as well as being the Truth. He arose from the dead to

become "The Life." Now what is offensive about all of that? To the humble, there is nothing offensive about it, but to the arrogant and proud, it is very offensive. We are told that God resists the proud but He gives grace to the humble. So if Jesus is offensive to some, then that is offensive to the Father because His gift of love and kindness is being rejected.

Why would men reject this gift? The answer is in John 3:19, "This is the verdict: light has come in to the world, but men loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil."

Study Number One Hundred Thirty Two – Some Principles of Encouragement

In the past editions of BARN-A-BOOK I have shared my thoughts on some passages of Scriptures that deal with the subject of encouragement. In this paper I would like to just share some random thoughts about encouragement as well as discouragement that can't be cured by medication, alcohol or any human activity. It may be true that those things may cover the symptom of discouragement, or give one a temporary boldness, but they are not cures.

Discouragement is an attack of Satan who uses discouragement to draw individuals away from God. I believe the Lord has provided ways to fight back against the Devil and perhaps in the process you will become able to share the gift of encouragement with people around you that you meet every day. This is not a systematic study on the subject but the principles will assist you and prepare you to help others.

- Your past and present do not have to and need not continue into your future. A man was asked, "Have you lived here all your life?" To which he replied, "Not yet." Whatever reality that is happening in your life today does not have to be the reality tomorrow. If you are burdened by a load of guilt, hurt, or anger, you can receive forgiveness. Don't wallow in the mud puddle of confusion. God is full of compassion, wisdom and guidance. Spend time and conversation with Christian friends.
- God's love is unconditional and absolute. While it is true that salvation and blessings come from surrender to the will of God and obedience to the Gospel, God loves sinners without condition and His love is complete. If there is one place on earth we should all feel at rest and peace it is home. It is there we know we are accepted and loved and there should be no dread in returning there if we have wondered away. Though some homes do not provide this peace and protection, God always does. He loves you because He created you and because He chooses to love you, now and every moment of your life. "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us," Romans 8:35, 37.
- No matter what sin you have committed, you can be cleansed by God. No matter how much guilt and shame you feel, you can be forgiven and have a newness of spirit. God's Word is absolute just as His love is absolute. The assurance of God's ever-present and free offer of forgiveness is one of the most encouraging truths that a person can ever receive or share with others. His forgiveness is offered to all, but it must be actively received. That's what the Bible is all about. God's offer of forgiveness is based upon the sacrificial death of Jesus Christ.
 - The supreme and definitive sacrifice for sin was made when God offered His own Son, Jesus Christ, on the cross. Jesus died on the cross, shedding His blood as a sin-free "lamb" without blemish taking on Himself the sins of the world. His sacrificial death eliminated the need for any further sacrifice. "Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the desert, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life," John 3:14-15.
- God takes away the old and gives the new. When we receive God's forgiveness, we are given a completely new nature. Our old spiritual nature with all its desires for self and sin is cleansed from us. Our hearts are made new, and our new spiritual nature has a desire for God. This is referred to by our Savior as being "born again." What Christians need to know is that when we sin after our salvation, there is a provision. That is found in 1 John 1:9, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." We can be renewed again.

After we have experienced the truth, that our past and present need not dominate our future by understanding God's unconditional love and forgiveness, we are able to help others. When we have enjoyed the blessings of the unconditional love of God and His renewing power, we certainly should be prepared to share those things with others, as encouragers.

I want to remind you of something I have said and have written many times: Not everyone has the "gift" of encouragement mentioned in Romans 12:8, but everyone should be encouraging as best they can as commanded in 1 Thessalonians 5:11, "Therefore, encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing." Here are some principles for those encouraging others.

- Above all, encouragement is grounded in unconditional love, just as God in Christ has done for us. A person needs to feel truly loved for whom he/she is in God's eyes. Such love must be received regardless of the person's actions, traits, or accomplishments. It must not be love that is granted for manipulative purposes. It must be love that is both perceived and actively received without any strings attached
- Before you can share encouragement with others, you must come to a firm resolve within yourself regarding what you believe about four things:
 - ✓ God's nature
 - ✓ Jesus Christ and His work on the cross
 - ✓ The relationship that God desires for His children
 - ✓ The work of the Holy Spirit in the world today

Encouragement flows from what you believe. It is always an expression of your faith in God. Conversely, discouraging words are always an expression of a lack of faith in God. Guard your words. But above all, build up your faith. The heart that is strong in faith is a heart that will naturally overflow in encouragement to others.

- As Christians, we are called by God to encourage others. We read in Scripture that we are to have "love for your brothers" with a "sincere love," 1 Peter 1:22. We are also told to "Show proper respect to everyone: love the brotherhood of believers, fear God, honor the king," 1 Peter 2:17. We are to build up one another in faith, Jude 20. We are to remind one another of the goodness and love of God, 1 John 1:1-4.
 - What an encouraging world we would live in if all Christians followed Christ's example and preached the Good News to the poor and tried to heal the broken hearted with kindness. Jesus plainly said that He came not to condemn the world, but that "the world through Him might be saved," John 3:17.
- As encouragers of others we must not forget what the Bible teaches very clearly and that is that good and bad times happen to believers and unbelievers alike. No person is immune to life's circumstances, both positive and negative, Matthew 5:45. We live in a fallen world in which both evil and good exist. At no time are we told that God spares Christians from all temptations, trials, or problems. We can be assured, however, that God is with us and remains with us when troubles come. Encouragers remind themselves of this truth when dealing with others.
- What can be learned from a present difficulty or trial? That is a question we need to ask ourselves when trouble comes to ourselves as well as when trying to help another Christian in trying times. God wants us to be whole in body, soul, and spirit. His purposes for us are always for our ultimate good. When we experience a time of difficulty our first question should not be "Why me?" but rather "God, what good are you desiring to work in me through this?" or "God what good can I see that I can share?"
 - ✓ He always wants to purify our lives
 - ✓ He always wants to mature us in Christ
 - ✓ He loves those he chastens

The answer, many times, can be found in examining these three things. Pray about it, find an example of it in the Bible, and counsel with other Christians.

As Christians we are commanded to encourage one another. First be encouraged by the love of God, and second grow in your encouragement by encouraging others.

The argument of James tells us to state to the world that we are wise, because we possess His wisdom, namely Jesus Christ and His Spirit, James 1:2-8.

humanity would certainly perish, Matt. 6:25; John 3:16 and spend eternity apart from God in a place of great suffering, Matt. 10:28; 11:23; 23:33; 25:41; Luke 16:22-28.
