



# Habenicht Gets Top Grid Job

Mervin R. Habenicht, 35, a coach and teacher in Bettendorf since 1969, has been named head football coach for Bettendorf high school.

His selection was officially approved at a special meeting this afternoon of the Board of Education.

Habenicht succeeds Ray Oles, who last month was appointed director of instruction for the school system.

As head sophomore football coach during the last two years Habenicht established a 13-4-1 record.

The new varsity coach, who also is a teacher in the social studies department, came to Bettendorf in 1960 after receiving a bachelor of arts degree in physical education from the University of Northern Iowa (formerly Iowa State Teachers college), Cedar Falls.

In the last 10 years he has served in the following football coaching positions:

Assistant sophomore football coach under Earl Page, 1960-61; assistant varsity football coach in charge of defense under Merrit Parsons, 1965-66; same job under Ray Oles, 1967-68; head sophomore football coach, 1968-70. He also has coached as assistant in varsity wrestling, head freshman wrestling and assistant ninth grade track.

He will continue as assistant freshman track coach. A new head track coach is to be named.

The appointment of a varsity coach brought this comment from Supt. Ray Stensvad: "Mr. Habenicht's greatest asset is his ability to communicate with the young men he coaches. I am sure he will make a great contribution to continuing our fine athletic program."

Parsons, who now is assistant to the superintendent, pointed out that "Hab" has had a variety of coaching experiences within the school system and "has met with success on all levels."

"He is well acquainted with our program and has the advantage of knowing the existing personnel and facilities," Parsons continued. "He has a genuine interest in the young men on and off the field and will produce many interesting football teams."

Wendell Hill, director of athletics at BHS, said Habenicht has firmly established himself in two important areas — "he has developed an excellent rapport with the student body and has demonstrated a very sound knowledge of football along with the ability to impart this knowledge to his teams."

The appointment also drew praise from Robert Owen, BHS principal, who said Habenicht's experience "merited his strong consideration and endorsement." "I am confident of his ability; he has demonstrated great interest in youth and we anticipate continued strength and growth in our Bulldogs' football program," Owen added.

Habenicht was graduated from Fort Dodge high school in 1953. He served in the armed forces for two years and then attended Fort Dodge Junior college for two years, receiving an associate arts degree there before going to UNI. He was a
