Bettendorf players and coaches celebrate after defeating the Ankeny Hawks, 21-16, for the 2007 Class 4A State Championship. The 2007 squad finished the season 13-0 (only the fourth team in school history to go undefeated since the 1972 implementation of the Iowa football playoffs) and is second state title for Head Coach Randy Scott who has compiled an amazing 85-12 record since he assumed head coaching duties in 2000. Congrats to all players, coaches, and team members of the Bulldogs!

Remember when: 47 years ago in **1960**?...

1960 Iowa State champs

9-0 Bettendorf squad first to win state title

Just ten seasons after Bettendorf trotted out its first high school football team in 1951 the Bulldogs put away the state championship.

Led by Head Coach Merritt Parsons, the 1960 Bulldogs set a modern era scoring record by blasting nine straight opponents by scoring 381 points—an average of 42.3 per game. As



well, they beat every opponent by 16 points (or more) while holding their opposition to 11 points per game.

The '60 Dawgs also set a Quad City record for rushing yards, grinding out 3,976 yards for an average of 330.7 yards per game. Bettendorf also set a Quad City total offense record by amassing 3,589 yards or 398.8 yards per game.

Finally, the Bettendorf Bulldogs of 1960 were the fourth straight Bettendorf football team to win a conference title (three in the Illowa Conference before the final one in the Little Six) while also extending an unbeaten string of games to 26, the third-longest such streak in Quad City prep football history. Congratulations to the 1960 squad for their accomplishments!
