2009 Bettendorf squad finishes as M.A.C. Runner-up, loses in Substate Round to end '09 campaign with 8-2 record

Milestones such as extending conference winning streak to 21 games and 59 victories over last 63 M.A.C. foes since 2003 highlight season!

The 2009 Bettendorf Bulldogs once again came out of the gates swinging and jumped out to a 3-0 record before suffering a 28-10 loss to eventual 4A Quarterfinalist Clinton during Week #4. The Dawgs then responded by rattling off five straight wins which included a thrilling 25-19 double overtime win over Assumption which marked just the fifth overtime game in school history; ironically, of the five overtime contests Bettendorf has played, the Bulldogs have faced Assumption three times and own a 2-1 record against them.

The Bulldogs finished as the M.A.C. Runner-up behind Clinton and in the Substate Round were upset at home by Cedar Rapids Jefferson, 27-14. Although the loss was a disappointment to both the team and fans, people should be reminded that not only was this the first time since 1997 that Bettendorf failed to qualify for the playoffs, but that since 1998, Bettendorf has amassed a 124-19 record (.867%).

Second-year head coach Aaron Wiley improved his record to 19-3 and of the six head coaches in Bulldog history, only ranks behind Randy Scott's 22-3 record for most wins in their first two seasons of helming Bettendorf's football program.

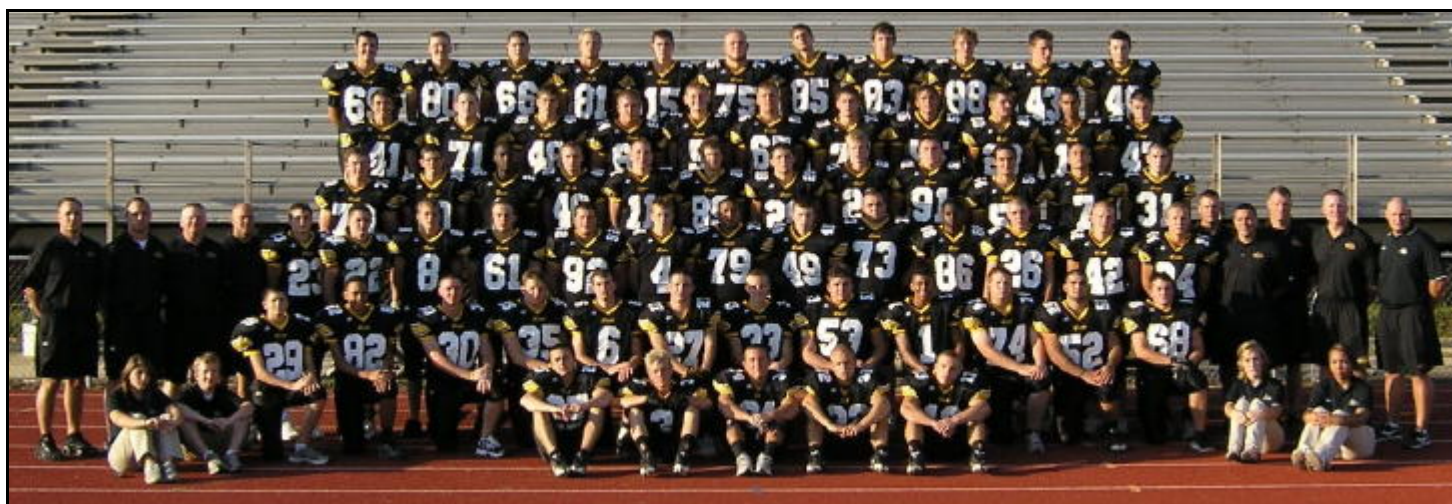
A total of 22 Bulldogs landed on the All-Conference squads while 10 Bettendorf players earned Quad City All-Metro accolades. Finally, three Bettendorf players earned All-State honors and included 2nd Team linebacker Daniel Byrne and 3rd Team selections of offensive lineman Jeremy Jacobsen and defensive lineman Brody Berrie.

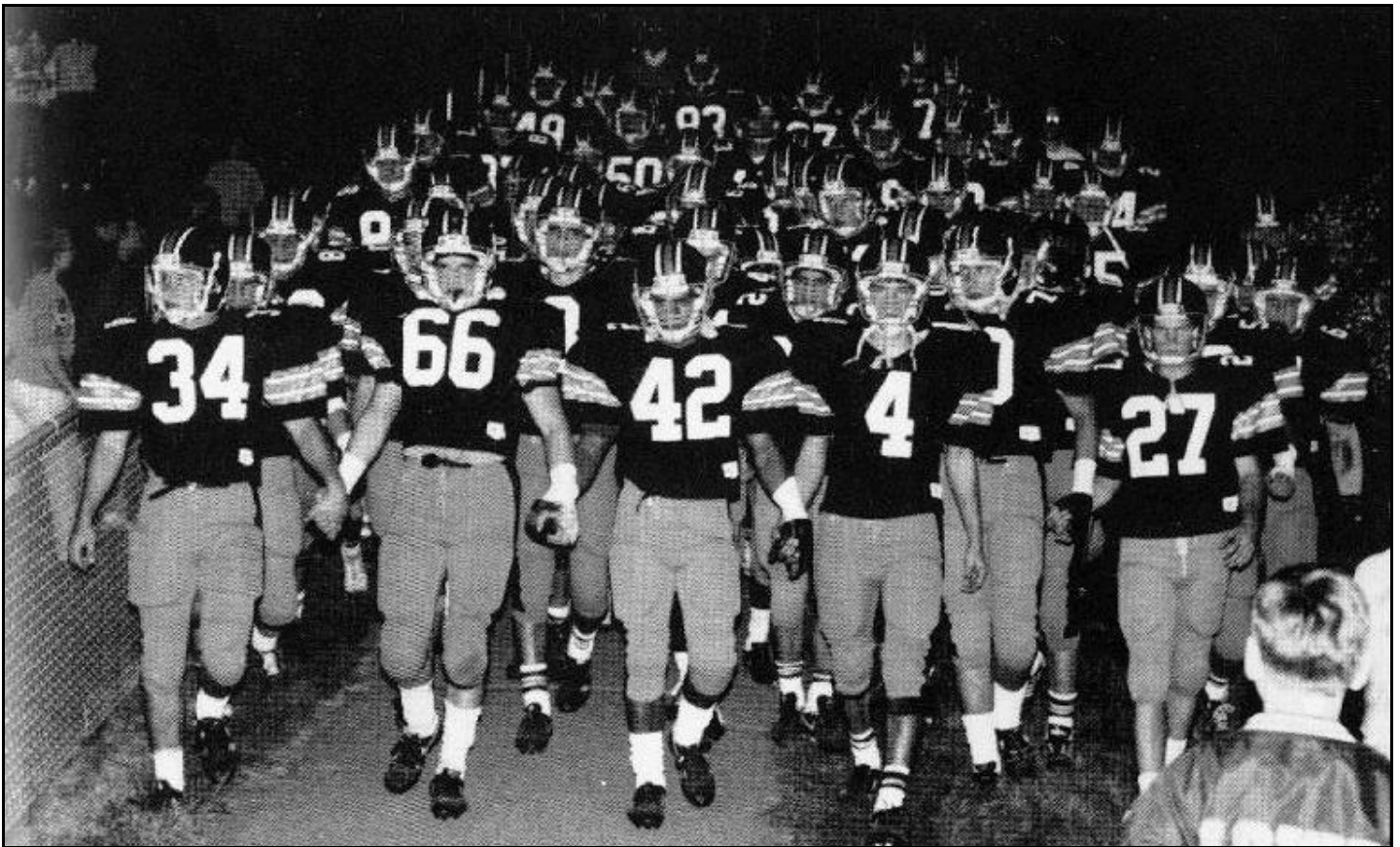

Remember when: 20 years ago in **1989**?...

Clash of the Titans: #1 and 8-0 Bettendorf defeats #3 and 8-0 Burlington, 34-27, in season-finale M.A.C. Championship Game

Championship game. Bettendorf was not only looking to extend its winning streak to 34-games, but also to capture its third-straight conference title—something that hadn't happened for the Bulldogs since 1957-59.

On **October 27th, 1989**, a true “Clash of the Titans” battle took place between the #1-ranked, 8-0, and *USA Today* “Team to Watch” Bettendorf Bulldogs and the #3-ranked, 8-0 Burlington Greyhounds in a season-finale M.A.C. Championship game. The game had immense implications as the Bulldogs were then-winners of 33-straight games dating back to the 1987 season as well as the two-time defending 4A state champions. While the Greyhounds led the M.A.C. in total offense, the Bulldogs had the #1-defense in both the conference and state as they only allowed 9.9 points per game. Over 7,000 plus people packed into TouVelle Stadium hoping to witness one last great game of the decade and the Bulldogs—led by All-Staters Tony LaMarre (RB), Wes Arensdorf (C), Mike Evans (OT), Ken Koehler (DE), John Elkin (NG), and Matt Rebro (LB)—smashed Burlington, 34-12, after leading 27-0 at halftime.

The win not only improved the Bulldog's record to 9-0, but also marked the 8th time since 1958 Bettendorf finished the regular season undefeated. Furthermore, the victory not only notched Bettendorf its 13th conference title, but also qualified the Bulldogs for their 7th Class 4A playoff appearance since 1980. After a 28-8 win over Assumption in the 1st Round and a 16-7 come-from-behind victory over Iowa City High in the Quarterfinals, Bettendorf's 36-game win streak came to an end when they lost to Linn-Mar (Marion), 25-7, in the Semifinals to end the season with an 11-1 record.
