Hello to all the newsletter readers of West Hempfield Presbyterian Church!

March 31, 2024 was Easter Sunday!

And the season of Easter continues until Pentecost Sunday, May 19, 2024.

All around the world followers of Jesus celebrate His Resurrection!

In last month's article we talked about the crucifixion, the suffering, and the humiliation. This month we get to talk about the resurrection, the joy, and the Good News.

When you read the story in Luke chapter 24, Luke includes an interesting detail that is not shared by the other gospels.

Two men/angels in clothes that gleamed like lightning greet the women early in the morning at the tomb where Jesus was laid. (That part is not unique to Luke, but keep reading.) In Luke 24:5 they ask, "Why do you look for the living among the dead?"

As we make this shift from crucifixion/death to resurrection/life, that question sticks with me.

Why do you look for the living among the dead?

Of course, they are speaking of Jesus, who is not dead. "He has risen!" (verse 6) But I think Luke included this detail because he understood this question can mean so much more.

Why do you look for the living among the dead?

How often, and in how many ways, do we place our attention and our focus on death instead of on the things that lead to life?

Rather than focusing on what is good and what brings life, we talk about all that is wrong with the world, all of the bad, the things that scare us or make us angry. We focus on the negatives. Death. As Satan tempted Jesus in the wilderness after His baptism, we also are tempted. (Luke 4:2-3) We want bread to fill our hungry stomachs. Sometimes we can focus so much of our attention on the growling coming from inside, that we fail to see the feast is already prepared in front of us.

Why do you look for the living among the dead?

Jesus is the Bread of Life (John 6:35). Jesus offers the Cup of the New Covenant (Luke 22:20). "whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life." (John 4:14).

Jesus has already prepared the way of life!

Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. (Philippians 4:8)

God's way of love and mercy, kindness and joy, praise and thanksgiving in all circumstances, does not always come naturally or easily to us, but it is the way that God calls us to follow. One full of life and resurrection. One worthy of celebration.

PARTIAL ECLIPSE—APRIL 8, 2024

Solar eclipses occur when the moon passes directly between the sun and Earth's orbits, creating an eclipse of Earth's view of the sun.

Did you know there are some Bible stories that might be referencing an eclipse?

Job 9:7 says that God can "speak to the sun and it does not shine."... that sounds like an eclipse!

As part of the Holy Week story, in Luke 23:44-45 when Jesus died on the cross "darkness came over the whole land" and "the sun stopped shining."

Joshua 10:12 is usually translated Joshua told the sun to "stand still" and that "the sun stopped" ... but the first phrase is better translated to say that Joshua told the sun to "be silent" and the second phrase could then means that "the sun stopped shining" like an eclipse. To make sense of the rest of that story, if the eclipse was at sunset and prevented them from seeing the sunset, then they might have accurately said that on that day, the sun never set!
