Construction of this vaudeville silent movie house began in 1920. Financial failure halted construction on the *Electric Theater* with the outside walls only partially completed. Purchased by Claude Keller and A.F. McGee Sr., the theater was completed and opened July 19, 1924 as the New Liberty Theatre.





OUR LOGO

In 1992, the ECCBC commissioned the University of Louisiana at Lafayette art department to create a logo for the organization. After a meeting with Dwight Jodon, Pat Dossman and the depart-

ment, approximately fifteen art students set about the task of designing an appropriate ensignia.

Several of the proposed designs centered around the organization's acronymn, ECCBC. However, the winning design was a simple graphic. It symbolizes the semicircle staging used by musical ensembles globally. The image is one in motion as the conductor's baton sweeps across the design. This particular logo was selected because of its simplicity and because the ECCBC is determined to move forward into the future with the mission of sharing the gift of music with the residents of Acadiana.

We will begin using the logo more frequently to identify the organization. We are proud to celebrate our sixteenth birthday this year, and are excited about our future. It is our desire that this logo become...a mark of excellence!

The Eunice Community Concert Band & Choir, Inc. was organized in February of 1990 with the intent to promote vocal and instrumental music in Eunice and the surrounding area. The organization is open to anyone who enjoys and appreciates vocal and instrumental music. There are no auditions or dues. We depend solely on the contributions of merchants and individuals and provide two concerts each year, July and December. The organization is operated by volunteers and pays no salaries.

In the last seventeen years the band and choir has produced thirty-five concerts. Also during our first seventeen years, we have provided music for: Eunice July Fourth celebrations, LSUE commencement exercises, city inaugurations, Eunice Centennial Celebration (performing an original work by Dr. Quincy Hilliard, ASCAP, commissioned by the ECCBC for the celebration, LSUE community fun days, Eunice Christmas celebrations, and presented concerts in Crowley, Oakdale, Ville Platte and Lafayette. 





Here's the Scoop On the French Horn

Orchestral and military brass instrument, a valved circular horn with a wide bell. It is normally a transposing instrument (its music written in a different tone than its actual sound) in F. It has a wide bore and three (sometimes four) rotary valves; its conical mouthpiece produces a mellower tone than the cup-shaped mouthpieces of other brass instruments. Horns long relied on separable crooks — circular lengths of tubing that could be attached and removed rapidly — for music modulating to new keys. The modern symphony orchestra usually includes four horns. Though difficult to play and prone to producing conspicuous errors, its

spicuous errors, its tone is widely admired.

Potter Publishers, 1999 1 medium loaf (about 8 ounces, or 12 medium-thick slices) brioche, challah, or other egg bread 4 eggs 2 cups whole, 2 percent fat, or 1 percent fat milk 2/3 cup heavy cream 1 pinch salt 1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract 1/2 cup granulated sugar 8 ounces very cold cream cheese, in 1 block Unsalted butter 1 cup raspberries, fresh or thawed frozen Coulis: 1 package frozen raspberries, defrosted Confectioners' sugar, to taste 2 tablespoons freshly squeezed lemon, or to taste Warm 6 serving plates in the oven at 200 degrees. Slice the bread into 12 pieces. In a bowl, whisk the eggs until

forem. Add the milk, cream, salt, vanila and granulated sugar and whisk to blend. Pour into a sheet pan with sides. Arrange the bread slices in the pan in a single layer and let soak. Meanwhile, using a sharp knife, cut the cream cheese into 12 thin slices. Heat a large skillet or griddle over medium-high heat. Add about 1 tablespoon of butter and melt until foamy. Working in 2 batches if necessary, arrange the soaked bread slices in the skillet. Cook until lightly brown, about 3 minutes. Lay 2 slices of cream cheese on top then place 1/6 of the raspberries on top of the cheese. Place another slice of soaked bread on top and press firmly with the back of a spatula. Turn the "sandwich" over and brown on the other side, about 3 minutes more. Transfer to warmed serving plates. *Coulis: In a large bowl puree defrosted raspberries. Stir in confectioners' sugar and lemon juice to taste. Through a fine sieve into a serving bowl, strain raspberries.*
