

OLD HOME DAY 2023

Following is a list of things that can happen during Old Home Day if we have volunteers for them as well as an idea of the time commitment needed.

Parade-

Antique vehicles, floats, fire truck, tractors, music/band, kids decorated bikes/wagons etc.

This is one of the biggest commitments. It will take a few folks to help.

Petting zoo

A small area set aside probably on Peter Hatt's property on Glebe Road.

The volunteer would need to get residents to allow their animals to spend a set period of time for petting.

(example...from 1pm to 3pm)

Vendor spaces - we have a volunteer

Photo Booth

Someone to spend a good portion of the 3 day weekend taking photos from the meet and greet on Friday thru whatever can be scheduled Sunday morning. At the very least, a booth for residents to sit for a photo shoot (guessing mostly children) who can dress up in costumes or not. The photos would be available to purchase once uploaded. This would be a remembrance of the day.

Sac races

Someone to come up with sacs and oversee maybe 30 minutes of fun with prizes on Saturday

Pie eating contest /Pie and Bake Sale - we have a volunteer

Raffle- donated items

Someone to reach out for donations, display them and sell tickets. This could be Saturday only and for a specific amount of hours if not all day.

A Town Play

This is another large commitment.

This will take many folks to pull this off as we need actors.

Cow flop

Something that would be done Saturday for a specified amount of time. Need a cow or two.

Bouncy house

Someone to monitor this for a specific amount of time as well as locating a bouncy house

Corn Hole contest

Someone to set up, set rules, give out prizes. Saturday for a specified time. Maybe an hour or so.

Tug of War

Someone to set up a large rope and rules for the tug. This is mostly for fun.

Maybe an hour at most.

Kids games with prizes

This can be as many games as the volunteer chooses.

This would be Saturday afternoon for maybe 2-3 hours.

This could be a good opportunity for students to fulfill their community service project by manning one of the games.

Meet and Greet-Friday we have a volunteer

Softball/Soccer games

Someone to set up the games with rules. Married vs single, parents vs children etc. It can last as long as the volunteer decides. This again is mostly just for fun.

Ice cream social

Someone to set up and man an ice cream station for a specified amount of time.

Sunday Service

A flyer with a schedule of events and a map of where the events will take place.

T- Shirt and design

Using the chosen theme (which we will announce at the next meeting)

Asking Principal Mark Hayward if the students could be part of the design either by a contest or a collaboration of student's ideas and art.

There are shirts left over from the last Old Home Day that could be used. They have no design on them so one could be added.

Also if students volunteered for activities, could this count towards their community service project.

Food Truck - part of vendor spaces

Bottled water station

Someone to set this up and hopefully get the water donated so that there would not be a cost other than maybe a donation box.

Porta potty

We need to discuss whether this is needed. If we have the facilities at the Town Hall and the Fellowship Hall we may still need something at the School.

Clean up crew

This would be done at the end of the day on Saturday.

Again, this could be done by students who want to satisfy their community service project.

We will need to clear with Principal Mark Hayward, that students can do these activities for community service.

We would love any additional ideas for fun activities if you are willing to volunteer for anything not listed here.

We do have money to pay for prizes etc. however we would welcome donations of products or money to help pay for the things we will need to pay for.
