Prints of Peace



As Lutherans, when we talk about Jesus, our focus is usually on *what Jesus has done for us*. We talk a lot about the cross, and about the resurrection. We talk a lot about how Christ is the Light of the World and has brought us life and hope and salvation. Much like the Creed we speak each week, our focus has usually been on what Christ accomplished in the final week of his life, rather than on the rest of it.

For this reason, I often found myself a little amused by the WWJD ("What Would Jesus Do") movement from a few years ago. I think the idea was, when you're facing a choice, think about what Jesus would do in the same situation, and then do the same thing. But my answers to "What Would Jesus Do" are usually "well, he would die for our sins" or "he would be raised from the dead by the Father" or "he would send the Holy Spirit to us." And those aren't really things we can do when faced with a tough decision!

Anyway, as Lutherans, we tend to view Jesus more as the Son of God, the Savior, and so forth – and less as a teacher and role model. But he is those things too! And July is a great time in the church year to spend some time talking about that. The gospel readings we will hear from Matthew's gospel this month are filled with stories of Jesus as *teacher*.

For three of these weeks, we will hear Jesus telling *parables*. Parables are weird stories, stories that start to make less and less sense the more you look at them. And that's the point. Jesus told stories like this whenever he talked about the "kingdom of heaven," because God's kingdom is not something that can be understood in a normal way. The closer we get to God, the more words start to fail us, and the more we have to rely on imagery and poetry, intuition and story. Jesus is telling us some really important stuff, but it can be hard to understand.

The good news is that we don't have to *understand* all of it. We're just called to *listen*, to *learn*, to *live* in the kingdom of God. So come on out and listen with me to the teaching of the Son of God. We'll sit as his feet and listen and learn and live. And maybe, we just might grow in the process.

Join me for worship in July.

NexTrex Challenge:



12 gifts totaling \$527.50 were received for the fund from January 1st through May 31st. There have been no disbursements.



OF NORTHERN STITCHES, CONTAINER SHIPS, PORT CHAP-LAINS AND SEAFARERS: A JOURNEY OF HOPE THRU SIH

t is a Thursday morning at Calvary Lutheran Church in Bemidji, MN. Canada is just 107 miles away. The winter morning is brisk, 7 degrees, with a stiff breeze out of the north.

This means it feels like way too many degrees below zero.

For the 8 to 10 women who are here, cold temps, icy winds,
even blowing snow can't keep them home. The call to serve
others through the art and craft of quilting is too compelling. Colors surround them, blues and greens, browns and
oranges, reds, yellows, floral and stripe, squares and scraps,
piecing together discarded fabric into warmth which becomes shawls and tents, blankets, a wedding dress, maybe
even a death wrap for those fleeing war or the ravages of
climate change. But here in the north, it is simply the joy of
community and service.

Today I imagine the journey the quilts will take, from the cold north to a warehouse, into a container bound for a need somewhere in the world. Ukraine or Lebanon? Mali or Burkina Faso? I imagine them loaded onto a train or truck on its way to a port, part of the Seafarers International House (SIH) network. Baltimore? Newark? Seafarers international House (SIH), the ELCA seafarers' ministry, has been that intersection where quilters from Bemidji, connect to a port chaplain, a seafarer, a dock worker loading up a container ship bound for somewhere across the Atlantic, through the Panama Canal, to places known and unknown.





For 150 years, hospitality and the welcome of strangers, support for seafarers and newcomers and refugees and immigrants, asylum seekers, this ministry has been a tapestry, a quilt, a piecing together of connection, support and a wayside rest. Perhaps some of the ancestors of these quilting women were assisted by SIH as they disembarked at Battery Park or Ellis Island, bound for a new home in a new land.

This is what interests me on a cold Thursday morning, how the stitches of these women, intersect with a dock worker, a seafarer, a port chaplain, an asylum seeker. This is why I continue to financially support this ministry and serve on its board with great joy, imagining and underwriting the hope, the intersections of strangers around the globe, all uniquely made possible through SIH. #







The Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod met in assembly from June 1-3, 2023 at Kalahari Resort in the Poconos. We gathered around Word and Sacrament, Song, Service, friendship, and food. We prayed together, worshipped together, and conducted the business of Christ's church for the first time, in-person, in three years!

In our time together we adopted changes to our constitution from the ELCA, elected a new Secretary, Rev. Ken Melber Jr, elected a new Vice President, Nancy Reichelt, and we adopted three new resolutions concerning money management in congregations, chaplaincy at Diakon home, and land acknowledgment concerning first peoples'.
