EASTER GLORY

The story of the first day of Easter is a story of three firsts. Mary Magdalene who first loved Jesus so much and was the first to visit the tomb, and later still was the first person to see the risen Lord. John the disciple whom Jesus loved and who likewise loved the Lord was the first to believe in the resurrection, beginning at the empty tomb. Peter, the acknowledged leader of the group, was the first among the deserters to witness with his own eyes the empty tomb.

Three diverse personalities! Three different points of view of the empty tomb! Three different intensities of believing! Three different ways of relating the story of the resurrection! All three are among the closest friends of the Lord. All three loved the Lord each in their own peculiar ways. All three have seen the risen Lord. All three zealously bore witness to the truth of Christ's resurrection through their personal lives.

What a great inspiration for us, a great joy and a great encounter of Easter. As Christians, we look at the empty tomb and we see in it Jesus' victory over death and our own destiny too. We have been rescued from the claws of death. Where, O death is your sting? Jesus has conquered death. This is not just an assurance that despite everything, things will turn in the right direction. This is an assurance that everything has turned out marvelously (for Jesus and for us). For his life and destiny are also ours.

The story of the first Easter began at the empty tomb but did not end there. The story traveled from place to place, from one time to another, through the Spirit working in the Church, and the people whose lives bore the marks of the encounter with the risen Lord. We, too, can truly claim to be children of the resurrection if we learn to relinquish the empty tomb of our lives and witness through our lives the greatest truth of Christ's resurrection. Have a piece of the good news of Easter.

Happy Easter to everyone! Happy Easter to our newly baptized and those received into Full Communion with the Church this Easter! You are hope and joy. Congratulations!!!

Easter Message 2024

"Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here but has risen" (Lk 24:5).

Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Diocese of Peterborough,

The Church embraces the celebrations of this Holy Week, commemorating the passion and death and resurrection of the Lord. Thereafter we advance quickly to the wonderful season of Easter, a time of renewal and hope and a time to see with the eyes of faith the great wonders that God has done and continues to do.

It is said that one of the best ways to get the attention of your audience is to ask a probing question at the start of a talk. So, give full marks to the angels at the Lord's tomb that Easter morning, who asked one of the most probing questions in all of history: "why do you look for the living among the dead?" Part challenge, part correction and part invitation to see things in a new way, it must have taken the faithful women by surprise. But apparently it was a rhetorical question, since the angels did not wait for an answer, but went on to explain, "He is not here, but has risen." Once they had the attention of their audience, they wasted no time in sharing the good news - good news that the women would also quickly share, as they went to tell the apostles.

Pope Francis has said that the question addressed to the women that Easter morning is posed to each one of us. "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" It's one that should grab our attention and invite us to a new way of seeing things. Do we cling to what is sterile, bleak, and hopeless, just because it is familiar? Do we give in to cynicism and defeatism, supposing that things in the world, the Church, our neighbourhoods, and families can never improve? Easter is a call to reject the malaise that can afflict so much of modern life and to embrace a new way of living with a spirit of hope. As the Holy Father has said, "Death, solitude and fear are not the last word. There is a word that transcends them, a word that only God can speak; it is the word of the resurrection."

The angels' question should snap us to attention this Easter, reminding us that because of the Lord's resurrection, we can always lay claim to hope. May God bless you and yours richly in this season of great joy.
