The financial report was given and approved on a Peterson/Alwin motion. A Peterson/Alwin motion to transfer funds and pay the bills, carried, there were no unusual bills.

Road Work- The highway contract was discussed, Weberpal had met with the Ben Coopman to discuss the town's concerns mainly the lack of oversight in what is being done on the town roads. The town attorney will be sending our concerns on to the town's association committee that is looking into the highway contract. It was noted that the accounting sheets will be changed for 2008. Peterson noted that we are under contract with the county even though we have not signed the contract. The understanding we have with the county is that the town will have the final say in what needs and has to be done. A Peterson/Alwin motion to approve the highway contract with the understanding that the town has the final say as to the work being done. A complaint about the stop sign on Co KK and Townline and the stop sign with the trees being in the right of way. This property is in Lima Township, a letter from the town should be sent expressing the concerns.

If we do our own clod patch a private company would do it for \$195.00 per tone, \$145.00 labor and \$50.00 for material. With the current county contract the town must spend \$80,000.00. The county will not perform any work unless the town gives the go ahead.

Community Center there are some cracks that need to be filled in the parking lot have the crack filling company look at. A resident offered the town 5 pine trees if the town would move them, the board will check in cost of moving. Randall stated that the carpets have been cleaned.

Complaints- Dunham summary judgment with the court.

Miller has until the end of the year to move his equipment out and store elsewhere.

Trewyn still checking on

Baertschi has a driver living in his home on A he does have an office in Janesville he is not running a business from that location, all vehicles are licensed.

Ochs Conditional use permit per the zoning ordinance, he is importing bedding and horse manure, this has been sent to planning and zoning.

Citizen's input- need to update the animal unit per acre in our zoning ordinance... If the town hires a private individual for the road work need a record of the tons used on any project.

Bill Harper from the Sheriff's department was present to check in with the town. The jail planning committee is continuing to work on plans and changes.

Peterson thanked Gib Mawhinney for his 25 years of service to the town on the zoning committee.

Complaints Dunham has stopped operating his business from his residence he is presently working for some one else. Our legal fees at this time are approximately \$9000.00 a settlement has been reached at \$6000.00 with payments to be \$100.00 per month. He is attempting to sell his equipment. A Mawhinney/Logterman motion to accept the \$6000.00 settlement and have the town attorney draw up the paper work, this will be discussed and approved at the next meeting.

Ochs request has been put on hold until the town reviews and applies a livestock facility siting law. The town attorney is working on this. It was noted that the attorney is on retainer and did not do his job.

Road work- the proposed road work with the county for 2007 was discussed Johnstown will not have a patrolman patrolling the roads from the county. The county gave a price of \$18.00 per crack to do crack filling on Six Corners Rd, the board felt they should stick with Hoerling Crack Filling service. A Logterman/Mawhinney motion to spend \$125,746.00 with the county and \$15,400.00 with a private contractor, it was requested that we get something in writing from the county that they agree with the proposed work. At the next town meeting the board will need to decide if the town will remain with the county to do road work for 2008.

A Logterman/Mawhinney motion to pay mileage to town board members for checking the road at the current IRS rate at the present time that is \$.485 per mile, carried.

Zoning officer report he issued a building permit to Lloyd Hoyt for interior work at 11307 Co A, the conditional use permits for Beals and Ochs have been put on hold and he issued a burn permit to Jim Zanton.

Community Center Randall noted that the hot water heater needs to be turned up a little. Weber said all is ok there is 1 dead tree at the old town hall site.

The board of review will be held prior to the town board meeting in June it will be adjourned until the assessor has the revaluation done.

Citizens input an inquiry as to when the assessor will be in the area, the clerk will check with him. A question about the variance issued on Co A per legal council he stated that the board of adjustment could issue.

A request to move citizens input to the first part of the agenda will try for a few meetings to see if makes a difference.

Road work- a discussion was held on the road work for 2008 and if the town should contract with the county to have the work done. Peterson has been checking with the town of Bradford to see who does their work and various private contractors to see if there is any interest from them to do the town roads. If the town contracts with private companies we made need to look into having a road commissioner, more discussion will be held at the next meeting. A Logterman/Mawhinney motion that we not sign the contract with the county for 2008, carried; Peterson will contact the town attorney and have him send a letter to the co highway department. The board will discuss this at upcoming board meetings. The clerk was instructed to draft a notice to place in the paper requesting proposals for road work to be acted on at the next meeting. Peterson has been working with the Chair from the Town of Lima dividing L_J Townline rd with the E end consisting of 3.3 mile will be the town of Limas' and the west end consisting of 2.7 miles will be the responsibility of the Town of Johnstown. With an agreement that if the bridge by Vickerman needs replacement that Lima will pay for 1/2 of the cost. A Mawhinney/Logterman motion to approve carried. Peterson will present this to the Lima Town board at their next meeting

Complaints- Dunham still has equipment sitting around would like to add to the stipulation; some of the items were in the stipulation that he could have them on his property until they were sold. A Mawhinney/Logterman motion to approve with the addition of the check must be certified (verified) when being sent.

Zoning officer Hoyt reported that he has an application from Kell's to remove a restriction from there conditional use permit the hearing will be July 11, 2007 at 7:00 p.m. It was suggested that maybe the town attorney could come out early and review the siting ordinance, Peterson will check with him and get back to us.

Community Center- Randal had no concerns Weber noted that a tree fell west of the property once it cools down it will be sawed up; he said the crack filling around the hall was done very well.

Correspondence- The towns association is asking that we call our senators and ask that they increase the town's share of highway aids to 2100.00 per mile (that is a 2% increase)

Road Work- the Town of Lima proposed that Johnstown take full responsibility for the bridge. A Peterson/Logterman motion to turn down the proposal from the Town of Lima and to continue as we have been, carried.

A Mawhinney/Peterson motion to appoint Dennis Logterman as Town Road Superintendent, carried. This position will start in August and mileage will be paid once per month. Current road work for 2007 crack filling will be done, ditch mowing for the entire town, seal coat Rye rd, suppose to be done on July 16, it was felt that the county did not live up to their end of the contract. It was noted that weeds are to the edge of Emerald Grove Rd.

Zoning- A Peterson/Mawhinney to accept the resignation of Bruce Morgan from the Appeals Board, carried. The planning and zoning committee will meet with the town attorney on Aug 7, 2007 at 6:00 p.m. to review the proposed siting ordinance.

The judge has accepted the arrangement with Joe Dunham, he is making timely payments.

Community center- Vicky would like to have a screen door on the kitchen door to cut down on the bugs, and place a ceiling fan in the kitchen to help keep it cool, Weber will check on. Scharine discussed a proposal to place a cover over the sign to help prevent vandalism; he estimated the cost between 350 and 500. dollars.

A request from the county for a contribution for the upcoming clean sweep will be placed on the next agenda

The financial report was reviewed and approved on a Logterman/Mawhinney motion. A Logterman/Mawhinney motion to transfer funds and pay the bills, holding the bill for the Milton Fire Department for 950.00 and the Rock Co Hwy Department for 721.24 until we receive an explanation of what the charges are for, carried.

Citizens input- Concern over the weeds on the roadside, this will be discussed under road work.

Road work- The board discussed the fact that the Rock Co Hwy department has not completed some of the work they had agreed to, the board will plan a meeting with Ben Coopman and Terry Staver to try and resolve the following; Rye Road has not been seal coated, weeds on the roadside in some places are higher than the corn, and what we need to do to fulfill our contract with the county.

Peterson will set a date for the board to meet with the county.

2008 road work the notice should be put in the paper and notices sent to local contractors; DR Amon, Franks, Silha, Rock Road and Yoss, Proposals will be discussed at the next town board meeting. Peterson stated that the meeting with the Town of Lima did not go well Peterson will redraft a proposal and send to Lima to see if we can reach an agreement.

Zoning officer- he issued a building permit to Brent Steinke for a garage. Roger Quade asked for a conditional use form for sludge application.

A Logterman/Mawhinney motion to appoint Charles Scharine to the Board of Adjustment, carried.

The request for sludge application to the Quade farm was discussed, in 1994 the City of Whitewater had made a request to apply city sludge to 8 properties in the town, the planning and zoning approved the request and in the conditions stated that it would be renewed yearly unless there were complaints. The board felt there should be current written agreement with the city concerning damage to roads. Sludge trucks can weigh up to 40,000 pounds. A question concerning Scharine having semis on the road delivering product, Scharine stated that the trucks are never fully loaded.

Clean seep donation, the board felt this is a worth while program but will wait to see what participation there is from the town and make a donation afterwards, on a Logterman/Mawhinney motion.

Community center Weber noted that the wiring for the stage is done the fan for the kitchen was discussed a Mawhinney/Logterman motion to give Weber authority to spend up to \$1000.00 on having a fan installed in the kitchen. The fire extinguishers have been checked and some replaced. A complaint on the front door not being able to get unlocked, Weber will contact the lock smith and have it taken care of. The sign cover for the outside sign was discussed and was tabled until a later date.

The next meeting date was discussed; the clerk will not be here on the 17 a Logterman/Mawhinney motion to change the next meeting date to Wednesday September 26 with the public hearing on the siting ordinance prior to the meeting, carried.

The agenda was reviewed and approved on a Logterman/Mawhinney motion. Citizens input: Carmen Corewith (former Newton farm) asked about the drainage problem he is having on his property, Logterman will check on and will contact Corewith and discuss what can be done. Questions about the assessor and if he was in the area, the clerk stated that she has been in contact with him and he plans on being done by the first week in October. A complaint about the salvage yard and cars sitting outside the fence. Those present were reminded of the break-ins that have been happening and to be on the lookout for a white van.

The clerk's report was read and approved on a Mawhinney/Logterman motion. Peterson stated that he has a letter from the City of Whitewater dealing with damage to the roads if the City hauls slurry in the town

The treasurer's report was read and approved on a Logterman/Mawhinney motion. The bills were approved on a Mawhinney/Logterman motion.

The siting ordinance for the town was discussed; a public hearing prior to the town board meeting had the following recommendation: The planning and zoning committee recommends that the town adopt the siting ordinance as presented. A Mawhinney/Logterman motion to approve siting ordinance 07-01.

Zoning report a building permit to Richard Stanley for a shed and a burning permit to Kim Mawhinney.

The Buck skimmers were present to thank the town for allowing them to have their encampments in the town for over 20 years they have lost their lease on the former Newton property, and asked if there was someplace else in the town that they could meet.

The contract with the county for voter registration services was presented and approved on a Logterman/Mawhinney motion.

Road work- the board met with Terry Staver and Ben Coopman to discuss the road work with the town. They were informed that there would be no seal coat done this year for the town and that they would re-mat Emerald Grove Road for \$63,500.00, mowing for the town would be \$8000.00 (or less) and that the 2nd mowing will be at least 15" from

the edge of the road. The board felt that they are living up to our end of the contract and the county is not.
