

The January 18, 2010 meeting of the Johnstown Town Board was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Chairman Logterman. The meeting was posted in 4 locations in the town and on the town's web site. Present: Dennis Logterman; Carmin Corwith; Robert Mawhinney; Patsy Weber and Mary Mawhinney. Absent: none.

The agenda was reviewed and approved on a Mawhinney/Corwith motion. The clerks report was read and approved on a Corwith/Mawhinney motion. The treasurer's report was reviewed and approved on a Mawhinney/Corwith motion. A Corwith/Mawhinney motion to transfer funds and pay the bills, carried, there were no unusual bills.

Assessor- the board was brought up to date as to where the town is with the assessor. The town's records have not been kept up to date in the files and the computer discs that have been received have very little data on them. Jacobson's Appraisals was present to discuss some of the concerns. The board felt that we should do a complete re-valuation of the town; Jacobson said he had the time but it would be later in the summer when the work was complete. The charge to do the complete re-val would be \$21,900 for 2010 and \$6,200.00 for 2011. All properties will be put in the market drive program and be current. Jacobson also stated that he has a toll free number and they do return all phone calls. A Logterman/Corwith motion to hire Jacobson Appraisals as the town assessor, carried.

Humane Society contract- Logterman had contacted the society that we would authorize \$300 for pickups of dogs only, they rejected it. If town residents have a problem they are to contact Logterman. The state statues state that a town only needs to take care of dogs. The board will continue to look at this.

Road work-Snow plowing the seal coating on some of the roads is peeling up, mainly Lima Center Rd. this should be discussed with the seal coat company. Richard Stanley said the roads were plowed but it took 3 days to put sand down. The board reminded those present that the roads will not be pristine but if there are problem areas to please contact a board member. There has been no contact with Enbridge.

Community center- everything is running smooth.

Zoning nothing for this month. There were phone calls concerning the salvage yards, Logterman will contact. The board needs to sit down with the attorney and go over the ordinances of the town and follow the complaint and fine parts of them.

Logterman handed out the 911 communication notice, and the sheriff report of what has been happening in the town.

Zoning officer report- he has nothing to report at this time. Steve Wickingson attended the Working lands program put on by the Rock Co Planning Department. There will be numerous changes to the farmland preservation plan and the town needs to be updated on the changes as a lot of them will be done by the town. The clerk will contact the Planning Department and get some dates for them to come out.

Road Work- The board will need to start planning for the road work for 2010. Enbridge had sent out a letter the town attorney said we should not sign until get some clarification. The attorney will be in contact. The clerk requested that the town draft a letter to the Co Highway Department concerning Co M. Maurice Peterson asked about the town posting roads for the spring, this will be on the March agenda.

The request from Emergency Management to sign the agreement was discussed, a Mawhinney/Corwith motion to table until March 15 carried.

There has been nothing new on the contract with the Humane Society. The old assessor the town attorney is filing forms.

The resolution from Emergency Management a Corwith/Logterman motion to approve as written. Logterman appointed Corwith as the town's designee.

Road work- Logterman received a call from Scott Hoerling, Crack Filling service the board needs to set a date to ride the roads. Still waiting to hear from Enbridge with a figure. The board will plan on re-matting 1 mile of road this year, either Lima Center or Hake Road and 3-4 miles of seal coating. There is hole in Scharine Rd Silha needs to look at and fix. Mawhinney will check on the wording for our road work notice. Road signs the board gave Mawhinney permission to order the signs he needs. The road name signs will be looked at in the fall.

Zoning officer report- issued 1 permit to Logterman for a remodel and new garage. The working lands meeting will be at the court house April 6 at 9: a.m.

Community Center- all is ok toilets have been fixed all the limbs picked up from the winds. Logterman had his brother a retired plumber look at our bathrooms if we start upgrading we may open a can of worms with the state and the disability act, any repairs are ok.

Logterman received a letter from the census bureau concerning the 2010 census and to make sure everyone sent theirs in.

The annual report was presented and approved on a Mawhinney/Logterman motion. Items to be discussed at the annual town meeting were discussed and include the recycle contract, long term plan for road work, replacement of the town assessor and setting the salaries of the town board for 2012-2013.

The zoning committee and board will need to get citizens input for this. Dennis had received a call from Batterman offering to help fill out the paper work for the working land changes.

Road work- pot hole filling will be starting soon. Frank Bros have stated to make the "good" mix for patching. Tree trimming needs to be done on the South end of Lima Center Road. Mike Head will take down some of the trees; will need some help with traffic. Need to trim back overhanging branches this should help with saving the road. Seal coating the board hopes to do 1.5 miles this year, figuring approximately \$15,000.00 per mile. The prevailing wage report has been sent in just waiting for the state.

Community Center- all is ok. Weber had spoken with the fire department concerning their last inspection. They apologized and said they would make sure they made themselves known when entering the building.

The county will review this and may only mow 1 time in the fall.

The clerk requested the appointment of Kathleen Mawhinney as a deputy clerk for the upcoming election, a Logterman/Corwith motion to approve, carried. A Mawhinney/Corwith motion to have 3 poll workers for the fall primary and to have Johnstown Community Center as the polling place, carried.

Zoning officer- a permit to Maurice Sterken for a shed on an existing foundation.

Community Center all is ok. The roof was discussed and felt that white steel should be put on, Corwith will check on pricing.

Complaints- Schneider 1 week left until he needs to have it cleaned up, Logterman will check on. Ciciker has until Aug 6 to comply with the county order on his septic. .

Road work- Enbridge the attorney sent them another letter. The agreement with Harmony was discussed- the culverts are the responsibility of the Town of Johnstown 1.5 miles from Bingham to Townline and 1.5 miles from Cty A to the Bradford Townline are Johnstown's. A new post is needed at the stop sign on Scharine and Hake Rd. The rocks have been moved Scharine Rd, they were in the Right of Way.

This may be the last year Silha will bid this; the board will need to start to work on a long range plan for the town. A meeting will be set up at a later date.

Complaints- Snyder has not done any work to clean up, Civiker County gave him a date certain that he had to comply with county and town rules, Sartell driveway concerns; the board asked that Logterman send this to the town attorney stating that he can no longer use the driveway that he has created. Concerns were expressed about the Morse property on Hwy A; Logterman will contact the health department.

Road work- we are still waiting to hear from the Town of Lima concerning the division of Townline Road. Silha is still planning on doing 6 Corners Rd, Wickingson requested the town put a hold on the renovation for now and see how it goes this spring with flooding. All the mowing has been completed. Mawhinney noted that the signs arrived, the pot hole on Pember Road was discussed, and it should be fixed within the next week. A letter from Enbridge to sign off on the crossing they repaired, Logterman signed.

Community Center- Weber replaced the blades on the mower. The steel price for the portico will be discussed and acted on at the next meeting.

Community Center- everything is working ok. Corwith went over the quote for steel for the front portico it is \$1012.75, complete. The board will need to remove the old shingles and put up the steel and look into eaves, an exact measurement will need to be gotten before the steel is ordered.
