Welcome to the Learning & Development Newsletter!

One of the things that I enjoy doing when I am not working is walking in the countryside or by the coast. I was recently able to spend some time on the south coast at Southbourne. I had taken my son down to Southampton University for him to attend a placement conference as he is currently in his third year at university and coming towards the end of his placement year. I dropped him off at Southampton University in the morning and knew that I had 3-4 hours to occupy before he would be finished for our journey back home. I chose to head to the coast and spent a couple of hours walking along the seafront from Southbourne to Mudeford Spit. The walk takes you along the promenade and then up to Hengistbury Head walking through the nature reserve before reaching the beach huts that line Mudeford Spit.



I am not sure about you but I am aware that whenever I am able to be by the sea I instantly notice that I feel more relaxed and calm. It offers me an instant de-stress that only takes a matter of minutes to notice. It doesn't matter what the weather is doing, if it is sunny, windy, raining or dry, in all weather there is something special about being by the sea and the beach. Along the way I was able to pause and enjoy the views, the wildlife

and the sea as the waves rolled onto the beach. It offered an opportunity to take the time to notice some of the wonders and beauty of God's creation. It was an escape from the hustle and bustle of everyday life, a chance to reset and recharge. There was also the opportunity for lunch at the Café at Mudeford Spit too! It was also enough time for the car to be fully re-charged ready for the return journey to collect Jacob from Southampton and then back home.

Whilst it was only a relatively brief time I recognise the need to make the most of the opportunities that are available to spend time in nature, time by the sea, time to replenish my energy levels.

I hope that you will have the opportunity to make time and space to engage in whatever offer you with an opportunity to relax, re-energise and notice the world around you.





Flourishing is the theme for this month and so it seems appropriate to encourage opportunities to engage with nature and God's creation as this often reminds and prompts us to reflect on how we are called to consider our individual and collective response in being called to care for creation and all God's gifts. Way of Peace: District Needs Assessment


Do we live well with difference in the church? Tell us what you think!


