DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME ENDS



Even though most people will set their clocks **backward** 1 hour before going to bed Saturday night, November 4th; daylight savings time is doesn't actually reach its' end until Sunday morning, November 5, 2017, at 2 am. Sunrise and sunset will be about 1 hour earlier on Nov 5, 2017 than the day before.

There will be more light in the morning.

Also called Fall Back and Winter Time.

Daylight saving time did indeed begin in the United States during World War I, primarily to save fuel by reducing the need to use artificial lighting. Although some states and communities observed daylight saving time between the wars, it was not observed nationally again until World War II.

Of course, World War II is long over. So why do we still observe daylight saving time?

The Uniform Time Act of 1966 provided the basic framework for alternating between daylight saving time and standard time, which we now observe in the United States. But Congress can't seem to resist tinkering with it. For example, in 1973 daylight saving time was observed all year, instead of just the spring and summer. The system of beginning DST at 2 AM on the first Sunday in April and ending it at 2 AM on the last Sunday in October was not standardized until 1986. The rules changed again in 2007. DST now begins on the second Sunday of March and ends the first Sunday in November.





from the kitchen coconut Cream Pi

Ingredients:
1 10-inch baked pie crust
Filling:

1-1/2 cups toasted coconut shreds
2 cups half-and-half
1/2 cup sugar
3 large eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Topping:

2 cups heavy cream1 tablespoon vanillaOptional:

White chocolate shavings or toasted coconut

Directions:

Place the coconut shreds in the pie shell.

Place the pie shell on a baking pan lined with foil and coated with cooking spray.

Whisk together the half-and-half, sugar, eggs and vanilla and pour the mixture over the coconut.

Bake the pie for 35 minutes or until golden on top, puffy around the edges, and firm in the center. Cool completely before topping.

For the topping, combine the cream, sugar, and vanilla and whip until stiff peaks form. Spread the topping evenly over the pie. Garnish with white chocolate shavings or coconut.

From one Kitchen to Another

A jar of delicious cookie mix makes a great homemade gift, and these festive oatmeal cookies are particularly easy to mix up. Be sure to use oldfashioned (not quick-cooking) oats in this recipe for best texture.

For the mix

1 cup all-purpose flour 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon


1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/4 teaspoon fine sea salt

3/4 cup dried cranberries

3/4 cup brown sugar 1 cup rolled oats

1 cup white chocolate chips



into a 1-quart jar. Add the remaining mix ingredients in layers, pressing down lightly on each before adding the next. Seal jar. Package for gift giving

To prepare

1 egg

1/2 cup (1 stick) plus 2 tablespoons unsalted butter (10 tablespoons), melted 1/4 teaspoon baking soda

Preheat the oven to 350°F. Pour cookie mix into a large bowl and stir in egg and melted butter. Drop cookie dough onto ungreased baking sheets by rounded tablespoons, leaving 2 inches between each cookie. Bake until edges are just golden, 10 to 12 minutes. Cool cookies on the baking sheets for 5 minutes and then transfer to wire racks to cool completely.

Makes 2 dozen cookies

During the holidays, mixing cocktails to order may not be in the cards. Luckily this sparkling punch brings the party. Besides cranberries, experiment with freezing other edible goodies in the ice ring such as fresh rosemary or orange peel. The punch will sweeten as the ice ring melts.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup fresh or thawed frozen cranberries
- 2 1/2 cup lemonade
- 2 cups unsweetened cranberry juice
- 1 (750-ml) bottle sparkling white wine such as Cava or Don Simon









Place cranberries in a Bundt or tube pan. Add just enough lemonade to cover the cranberries. Freeze until just frozen, about 1 hour. Add remaining lemonade and 1 1/4 cups water to the ring. Freeze until solid, about 6 hours or overnight.

Let ice ring sit at room temperature for 5 minutes. Pour cranberry juice into a large punch bowl, and then unmold and invert ice ring, gently floating it in juice.

Pour wine around ice ring, stir gently and serve.




