Our Bible Study continues and the participation, not only in attendance, but also in response and questions, are outstanding.



From July 3rd to July 13th The Episcopal Church held its 79th General Convention in Austin. The General Convention is held every three years so there are obviously a lot of issues raised and resolutions voted on.

One of the more controversial issues was and is the matter of same sex marriages and associated with that is changing the Prayer Book. There was a proposed resolution that would have made the language of the prayer book more inclusive. My understanding is that it would have used language in the marriage ceremony that would be gender neutral. I think it is fortunate that it was rejected by the Bishops. That means that the prayer book will not be changed. And, even if there was a vote to change it at the next General Convention, it would take

years to make it available for use in our parishes and missions.

A resolution did pass allowing the continued use of the "trial rites" adopted by the 2015 General Convention and it continues to be only with the approval of the Bishop of each diocese, but it does not allow a Bishop to make an across the board denial of same sex marriages.

There were other issues, discussions and presentations, including Bishop Curry's missional priorities of Racial Reconciliation, Evangelism and Care of Creation among others which you may learn about if you go to the diocesan web site, dwtx.org.

On the issue of sexual abuse, it was resolved that the Church and our dioceses are called to self-examination, ensuring that we respond appropriately and as necessary.

Immigration was another issue. It was resolved that we do all that we can to alleviate suffering and Bishop Curry announced to a group gathered that, "We do not come in hatred. We do not come in bigotry. We do not come to put anybody down. We come to lift everybody up. We come in love because we follow Jesus, and Jesus taught us to love."



Grandma's Dark Pumpkin Pie



Ingredients:

2 cup cooked pumpkin
1/2 cup brown sugar
2 tsp pumpkin pie spice
1/2 cup sorghum
1/2 tsp salt
2 eggs
1-3/4 cup evaporated milk
1 unbaked pie shell

Directions:


Mix sugar, sorghum, salt, pumpkin and milk. Add well beaten eggs and pumpkin pie spice; Mix well. Pour into unbaked pie shell and bake at 425* for 15 minutes. Lower heat to 350* and continue baking for 40-45 minutes.

From one Kitchen to Another

Ingredients

- 1 pre-made graham cracker crust, homemade or store-bought
- 2 (3.4 oz.) boxes instant lemon pudding mix
- 2 cups whole milk
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- 1 1/2 cups heavy whipping cream
- 3 tablespoons powdered sugar
- 1 tablespoon lemon zest

Directions

 In a large bowl, whisk together instant pudding mixes, milk and fresh lemon juice until just combined.



2. Pour 1 1/2 cups of pudding mixture into prepared pie crust and set aside.

3. In a separate bowl, beat heavy whipping cream until stiff peaks form, mixing in powdered sugar until incorporated.

4. Take 1/2 of whipped cream and fold into remaining lemon pudding mixture. Spread whipped cream lemon pudding into pie crust, then gently top with remaining whipped cream.

Refrigerate until thoroughly chilled and set, then top with lemon zest, slice, serve and enjoy!

Ingredients:

1 (12 oz.) package mini chocolate chips divided 3 1/2 cups milk divided

1 (~14 oz.) box chocolate graham crackers 2 (8 oz.) blocks cream cheese room temperature, divided

1 (~3.4 oz.) package instant vanilla pudding 1 cup smooth peanut butter

1 (~3.4 oz.) package instant chocolate pudding 1 (12 oz.) tub frozen whipped topping defrosted

1 cup peanuts chopped

Directions:

Place half of chocolate chips (6 oz) and 1/4 cup of milk in small bowl. Cover and microwave on high for 30 seconds. Stir until smooth, set aside to cool.

Place 1/3 of graham crackers into a single layer in the bottom of a deep 13x9-inch baking dish.

Prepare peanut butter layer. Place 1 (80z.) block cream cheese in large mixing bowl. Beat with electric mixer on medium speed until smooth. Beat in vanilla instant pudding mix and peanut butter until smooth. Very slowly add in 1 3/4 cups of milk while beating until well mixed and smooth. Spread mixture on top of graham crackers in baking dish.



Place another 1/3 of graham crackers into a single layer on top of peanut butter filling.

Prepare chocolate filling. Place remaining 1 (8oz.) block of cream cheese in large mixing bowl. Beat with electric mixer on medium speed until smooth. Slowly beat in chocolate pudding mix, cooled chocolate sauce, and remaining 1 1/2 cups milk until smooth. Spread mixture on top of graham crackers in baking dish.

Place remaining 1/3 of graham crackers into a single layer on top of chocolate layer. Spread whipped topping on top of graham crackers. Sprinkle remaining chocolate chips then peanuts on top of whipped topping.


Cover and refrigerate chocolate lasagna for at least 4-6 hours or overnight before serving.


