A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE OF LAZY LAKE, BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA PERTAINING TO THE SUBJECT OF TAXATION; PROVIDING FINDINGS; ADOPTING THE TENTATIVE LEVYING OF AD VALOREM TAXES FOR THE VILLAGE OF LAZY LAKE, BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA FOR THE VILLAGE'S 2023-2024 FISCAL YEAR (I.E. THE TENTATIVE MILLAGE RATE); ESTABLISHING THE TIME, DATE, AND PLACE AT WHICH A PUBLIC HEARING WILL BE HELD TO CONSIDER THE FINAL MILLAGE RATE AND THE VILLAGE'S FINAL BUDGET FOR THE VILLAGE'S 2023-2024 FISCAL YEAR; PROVIDING DIRECTIONS TO THE VILLAGE ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE THEREFOR.

WHEREAS, on July 19, 2023, the Village Council of the Village of Lazy Lake, Florida ("Village Council") approved a motion to advise the Broward County Property Appraiser of: (a) the Village's proposed millage rate of **6.5000 mils**, (b) the Village's "rolled back rate" of **6.0576 mils**, and (c) that a public hearing will be held by the Village Council on September 28, 2023, to consider: (i) the Village's tentative millage rate and (ii) the Village's tentative budget for the Village's next ensuing Fiscal Year (which budget commences October 1, 2023 and continues through September 30, 2024 [herein, the "2023-2024 Fiscal Year"]); and

WHEREAS, the current year gross taxable value of real property within the Village of Lazy Lake for operating purposes which is not exempt from taxation has been certified by the Property Appraiser to be \$10,914,177; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council held a public hearing on September 14, 2023, as required b Section 200.065, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, at the September 14, 2023 public hearing, the first substantive issue discussed was the percentage increase in millage over the rolled back rate necessary to fund the tentative budget, and the specific purposes for which ad valorem taxes are proposed to be increased; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council has reviewed a draft tentative budget for the Village of Lazy Lake's 2023-2024 Fiscal Year, at the public hearing of September 14, 2023, and has made adjustments to the draft tentative budget as it determined necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council has computed a tentative millage rate which is necessary to fund the proposed draft tentative budget for the Village of Lazy Lake's 2023-

2024 Fiscal Year, and further, has computed the percentage by which the computed tentative millage rate exceeds the rolled back rate.

NOW, THEREFOR, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LAZY LAKE, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1: The foregoing recitals are approved as if set forth herein.

<u>Section 2:</u> There is hereby adopted a tentative millage rate for levying, imposition and collection of ad valorem taxes necessary to fund the Village of Lazy Lake's tentative

2023-2024 Fiscal Year Budget of **6.5000 mils**. Therefore, the levying of ad valorem taxes with such tentative millage rate is hereby also approved.

 $\frac{\text{Section}}{3}$ The tentative millage rate approved and levied in Section 2 of 6.5000 mils

is greater than the Village of Lazy Lake's rolled back rate of 6.0576 mils by 7.30%.

<u>Section 4</u>: The Village of Lazy Lake has no voted debt service millage.

Section 5: A Public Hearing shall be held by the Village Council at 6:30 PM. on September 28, 2023, in the Conference Room of the Sunserve Building located at 2312 Wilton Drive, Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida, to consider: (i) the Village's final millage rate which will be necessary to fund the Village's 2023-2024 Fiscal Year final budget and (ii), the Village's 2023-2024 Fiscal Year final budget.

<u>Section 6:</u> The Village Administrative Assistant is directed to send a copy of this Resolution to the Broward County Property Appraiser's Office and the Broward County Tax Collector within three (3) days of its effective date. The Village Administrative Assistant is also directed to post this Resolution on the Village of Lazy Lake's website.

WHEREAS, on July 19, 2023, the Village Council of the Village of Lazy Lake, Florida ("Village Council") approved a motion to advise the Broward County Property Appraiser of: (a) the Village's proposed millage rate of 6.500 mils, (b) the Village's "rolled back rate" of 6.0576 mils, and (c) that a public hearing will be held by the Village Council on September 28, 2023, to consider: (i) the Village's tentative millage rate and (ii) the Village's tentative budget for the Village's next ensuing Fiscal Year (which budget commences October 1, 2023 and continues through September 30, 2024 [herein, the "2023-2024 Fiscal Year"]); and

WHEREAS, the current year gross taxable value of real property within the Village of Lazy Lake for operating purposes which is not exempt from taxation has been certified by the Property Appraiser to be \$10,914,177; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 166.241(3) (2022), Florida Statutes, the Village posted a Proposed Budget Summary on the Village Website at least two (2) days prior to the September 14, 2023 hearing (which Proposed Budget Summary is the same as the draft tentative budget considered at the September 14, 2023 hearing), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "1"; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council has reviewed a draft, tentative budget for the Village of Lazy Lake's 2022-2023 Fiscal Year which has been prepared with assistance from the Accounting Firm, *Keefe McCullough*, and presented to the Village Council, and has made such adjustments to same as it determined necessary at the public hearing of September 14, 2023, and with such adjustments, such tentative budget shall be referenced herein as the "tentative budget"; and

WHEREAS, at the September 14, 2023 public hearing, the first substantive issue discussed was the percentage increase in millage necessary to fund the tentative budget, if any, and the specific purposes for which ad valorem taxes are proposed to be increased; and

WHEREAS, the tentative budget sets forth the total revenues, transfers, and balances (i.e., total appropriations and revenue estimate) for the Village's 2023-2024 Fiscal Year as being in the amount of \$ 145,000; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council has computed a tentative millage rate which is necessary to fund the proposed portion of the tentative budget for the Village of Lazy Lake's 2023-2024 Fiscal Year, and further has voted to approve such tentative millage rate.

NOW, THEREFOR, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LAZY LAKE, FLORIDA, THAT:

- **Section 1:** The foregoing recitals are approved as if set forth herein.
- Section 2: There is hereby approved and adopted the Village of Lazy Lake's tentative budget for the 2023-2024 Fiscal Year. For reference, the tentative budget is attached hereto as Exhibit "A."
- Section 3: A Public Hearing shall be held by the Village Council at 6:30 PM. on September 28, 2023, in the Conference Room of the Sunserve Building located at 2312 Wilton Drive, Wilton Manors, Broward County, Florida, to consider: (i) the Village's final millage rate which will be necessary to fund the Village's 2023-2024 Fiscal Year final budget and (ii), the Village's 2023-2024 Fiscal Year final budget.

A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LAZY LAKE, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT AND REGIONAL INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR E-911 COMMUNICATION SYSTEM BETWEEN BROWARD COUNTY AND THE VILLAGE OF LAZY LAKE TO EXTEND THE TERM OF THE SYSTEM AGREEMENTS FOR CONSECUTIVE TERMS OF FIVE (5) YEARS BEGINNING ON OCTOBER 1, 2023; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Village of Lazy Lake ("Village") and a majority of municipalities in Broward County entered into an Agreement with Broward County for Participation in the Consolidated E-911 Communications System to improve the safety of first responders and persons residing or traveling in Broward County, to eliminate or reduce call transfers that result in delayed responses, and to facilitate the migration to consolidated new technologies; and

WHEREAS, in conjunction with entering into the Participation Agreement, each municipality also entered into a Regional Interlocal Agreement, which was subsequently amended by a First Amendment in 2020, to allocate responsibilities for the deployment of technical resources and responsibilities for the countywide public safety communication systems (collectively "Systems Agreements"); and

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment has been drafted to extend the Systems Agreements for an additional five (5) year term, with automatic five (5) year renewals under the same terms and conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council finds it in the best interest of its residents to enter into the Second Amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF LAZY LAKE, FLORIDA:

Section 1. **Recitals Adopted.** That each of the above stated recitals is hereby adopted and confirmed. All exhibits attached hereto and incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

Approval. That the Second Amendment to the Systems Agreements is Section 2. hereby approved, said Amendment is attached hereto as Exhibit "1." The Second Amendment shall be effective on or about October 1, 2023.

Section 3. Authorization. That the Mayor and appropriate Village officials are authorized to execute the Second Amendment and to take any and all action necessary to effectuate the intent of this resolution.

Conflicts. All resolutions inconsistent or in conflict herewith shall be and Section 3. are hereby repealed insofar as there is conflict or inconsistency.

Severability. If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Resolution Section 4. is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this resolution.

Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon its passage Section 5. and adoption by the Village Council.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT BETWEEN BROWARD COUNTY AND THE PARTICIPATING MUNICIPALITY FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE CONSOLIDATED REGIONAL E-911 COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM

AND

COUNTY AND THE CHY OF Lazy Locke PROVIDING FOR COOPERATIVE PARTICIPATION IN A REGIONAL PUBLIC SAFETY INTRANET

This Second Amendment ("Second Amendment") is entered into by and between Broward County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida ("County"), and the municipality identified on the signature page below ("Municipality," "City," or "Participating Community") (collectively County and Municipality are referenced as the "Parties").

RECITALS

- A. County owns and oversees the regional E-911 consolidated communications system ("System"), which provides for the operations and technological infrastructure to support 911 call taking, computer-aided dispatch, and other functionality necessary for the operation of public safety answering points ("PSAPs"), as well as a countywide interoperable public safety intranet that supports closest unit response in life-threatening emergencies and regional specialty teams.
- B. The vast majority of municipalities within Broward County entered into the Agreement Between Broward County and the Participating Municipality for Participation in the Consolidated Regional E-911 Communications System, dated on or about September 30, 2013, which was subsequently amended by a First Amendment (as amended prior to the effective date of this Second Amendment, the "Participation Agreement"), in order to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare by improving the safety of first responders and persons residing or traveling in Broward County, eliminating or reducing call transfers that result in delayed responses, and facilitating the migration to consolidated new technologies, among other benefits.
- C. In conjunction with entering into the Participation Agreement, each municipality also entered into a Regional Interlocal Agreement, which was subsequently amended by a First Amendment (as amended prior to the effective date of this Second Amendment, the "RILA") with County to allocate responsibilities for the deployment of technical resources and responsibilities for the countywide public safety communication systems.
- D. County and the Broward Sheriff's Office ("BSO") are negotiating a new interlocal agreement (the "Operator Interlocal Agreement") pursuant to which BSO would staff and operate the regional PSAPs for call-taking, teletype (queries only), and dispatch services.

E. County and Municipality desire to amend the Participation Agreement and the RILA (collectively, the "System Agreements") to extend the terms of the System Agreements for coterminous, consecutive periods of five (5) years.

Now, therefore, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and adequacy of which are hereby acknowledged, County and Municipality agree as follows:

- 1. The above Recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference. All capitalized terms not expressly defined within this Second Amendment shall retain the meaning ascribed to such terms in the Participation Agreement or RILA, as applicable.
- 2. Except as modified herein, all terms and conditions of the Participation Agreement and the RILA remain in full force and effect.
- 3. The effective date of this Second Amendment shall be the date on which it is fully executed by County and the applicable Municipality, or September 30, 2023, whichever occurs first.
- 4. The provisions of this paragraph shall apply to both of the System Agreements, notwithstanding any contrary provision in either document. The terms of the System Agreements shall be coterminous and are hereby extended for a five (5) year period from October 1, 2023, through September 30, 2028, unless earlier terminated in accordance with this paragraph, and shall be automatically renewed for subsequent five (5) year terms on the same terms and conditions unless terminated in accordance with this paragraph. Any Participating Community may terminate the System Agreements upon at least 365 days' prior written notice to County; upon such notice, the Systems Agreements shall expire for that Participating Community as of the date stated in the termination notice that is at least 365 days after the date of the notice. Termination of the System Agreements by any one Participating Community will not terminate the System Agreements for any other Participating Community.
- 5. The Engagement Process set forth in Exhibit C to the RILA may itself be modified through the Engagement Process. Upon such modification, the modified Engagement Process shall automatically be substituted in place of Exhibit C to the RILA without the need for a written amendment.
- 6. Preparation of this Second Amendment has been a joint effort of the Parties and the resulting document shall not, solely as a matter of judicial construction, be construed more severely against one of the Parties than any other.
- 7. This Second Amendment may be executed in counterparts, whether signed physically or electronically, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same agreement.
