| Barriers Encountered | <p>Staff turnover in centers is still a enormous challenge. Time for Directors or staff to work with Consultants continues to be challenging as many are in rooms and need to help meet ratios. So emails, mail, and other forms of communication has been used to stay connected. Many programs are not operating to the capacity they want. Onboarding staff is time consuming and newer staff hired are coming in with less experience working with kids. CCR&R Staff have heard continually how stressful this is for Directors and others supervisory roles. CCR&R Consultants continue to try to reach out and connect, listen, help problem solve.</p> <p>A Center closed down for a PD day in Aug and staff were able to work as a group in the morning on IQ4K goals and program work and then in the afternoon work on individual virtual trainings and planning. | <p>Success Stories</p> | <p>Consultants have been working with new home providers to get Registered. Two providers became registered in Q1 and two additional providers have already achieved their registration in Oct. With funding from CVP, Consultants are working with those that qualify for a new Registration Start Up Grant for materials to use with the children in their care. Consultants work and do a onsite consultation visit with the provider and they look together at a list a predetermined materials and choose what may work best for their current children, environment, and goals. Funding has also been very helpful to support newer centers that have been working with a CCR&R Consultants on goals in areas of basic care like supervision. Gates have been purchased to help with environment needs and creating areas for meal prep, diapering, and handwashing that are safer for children and adults.</p> |
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
