<p>Reasons Reported for Not Enrolling</p>	<p>Agency could not reach or get response after initial intake.</p>	<p>Some intakes have not been returned with enrollment (denial or acceptance) information from partner agencies. I had to count them as "not enrolled" because I do not have confirmation on acceptance or denial of services. Reasons for non-enrollment as per outcome from partner agencies are agency could not reach or get response after initial intake, client is no longer interested in services, inability to reach client.</p>	<p>Some partners from the agencies have not returned all of the outcomes regarding the referrals sent out. These were counted as not being enrolled in services because of the uncertainty of denial/acceptance. The ones that I did list as declined were done due to agencies not being able to reach contact with them, or simply changing their mind regarding interest in the services.</p>

<p>Barriers Encountered</p>	<p>Occasionally there are language barriers between myself and the families needed to be screened, though with the help of trained nurses to translate, paperwork to reflect 13 languages, and the hospital issued iPads that can translate to any language encountered, I am still able to screen and complete referrals on these families. Occasionally, the partner agency members will not send every updated outcome for referrals took in, this can be due to not being able to contact the families or still attempting to get in contact with them.</p>			
<p>Success Stories</p>	<p>Many clients were given access to specific critical resources to aid in their family life quality. The families that were screened and did not end up engaging in services were still given access to the "What's Where in the Cedar Valley" directory in case any issues in their family or families they know may arise. A story I found particularly tender to my heart was in regards to a 14 year old girl who reared a child due to a sexual assault. With the resources she was given, she was able to connect with our childcare facility, CCR&R to</p>			

resources she was given, she was able to connect with our childcare facility, CCR&N, to help the process of the baby's grandmother become his daytime caretaker while the mom of the baby finishes up high school. I truly believe this program is not only beneficial, but vital to the people of the Cedar Valley.
