School Ready Funds	Preschool Scholarships Tuition assistance for income eligible families with a 3- or 4-year-old to attend preschool. Assistance is capped at no more than \$300 per student per month. If monthly costs are less than \$300, that amount is reimbursed. Additional programs were approved but did not have children enrolled who qualified. We had a unique opportunity with children attending Hawkeye Community College. Seven children receiving funding through another source during the school year were able to have continuity of care in the summer by having CVP cover the remaining months. The Cedar Valley's Promise Executive Director recieves all family applications to determine eligibility and notifies the family as well as the approved program.
