Barriers Encountered	Barriers come up with providers that may cause them to not attend training. Families that may be late or need other hours. Other commitments, family needs child care for their own children, and illness, or they forgotten. Again most of our trainings are held nights or occasional Saturday and CC providers work a full day and still attend a 2-3 hr. training.							
Success Stories	<p>We continue to find that BH providers still want to attend in persons trainings. Yes, there are many more trainings that are available to programs with regional and state trainings opportunities that are more virtually accessible. Our goal is to continue to offer in person opportunities. CCR&R Consultants are communicating to programs and encouraging providers to come and take a in person training, not only for the knowledge component but to be around others doing similar work, share their expertise and experience, and possibly make new/continued connections with other child care providers. Emails, post cards and phone calls were efforts made to try to recruit and remind about trainings. A 3 hr. training was held and trained by a staff from UNI Regents Center. This training was focused on sensory experiences and water play for infants and toddlers. Instructional materials of a water sensory kit were given out for each participant to take back and use with the children in their care to implement what they learned in the training the very next day.</p> <p>No trainings have had to be cancelled this Q3 because of low registration.</p>							

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
