

Questions to ask your invasive species contractor

Finding the right contractor for your project can be challenging. Asking some of the questions below can help you to find the right contractor for your project.

- Do you have prior experience with this type of project?
- How long have you worked on invasive species control?
- What is your educational background?
- Do you have any certifications or special training? (arborist, pesticide applicator, etc.)
- If so, what is your certification number?
- Are you insured, and if so, can I have a copy of your proof of insurance?
- What method of control will you use? (type of herbicide and application method, cutting, pulling, etc.)
- What impact will invasive treatment have on the native vegetation currently on site?
- How will you dispose of woody debris? (pile it on site, take off site, etc)
- Do you have experience controlling "X" species? (some species are more difficult to control than others)
- Will you just control the species in question, or will you also scout/control any additional invasives onsite?
- What is your timeline for removing the invasive species? (Some species may require multiple treatments over several years.)
- What are your fees and what services do you provide?
- What is your hourly rate?
- How much do you charge to give an estimate?
- Do you require a deposit? If so, how much?
- How do you manage scheduling?
- Who will be my contact person during the project?
- Can you provide me with references from previous clients?
- What guarantees can you give me?
- Will you provide a written contract?
