<u>Important Note</u>: In order to accrue points for promotion through the USJA, an individual's USJA membership <u>must be current at the time the points were earned</u>. If there has been a lapse in membership or Life Member's SLM, any points earned during that time cannot be counted for promotion. If back dues are paid you will receive TIG but not promotion points to that period.

COMPETITION

USJA players can earn promotion points for competition in Shiai (individual or team) or Kata (form competition). The individual and team competition must involve competitors from at least two clubs. Contests within your own club do not qualify for earning promotion points. No points are awarded for winning by hansoku-make (disqualification), kiken-gachi (withdrawal), and fusen-gachi (default), as no skill was required by the winner to earn such a win. **Uncontested divisions are not eligible for points**. Documentation must be included to verify points including the name & date of the event, event host/director, and the name of competitor. Non-documented events will not be considered.

SERVICE TO THE USIA

Promotion points are awarded to USJA members who donate their time, energy and skills to the USJA. The USJA promotional system recognizes those members who support and provide service to the association. The USJA awards specific points for coaching, teaching, refereeing, hosting tournaments, conducting clinics, and various other functions that benefit Judo and the association.

<u>Activity</u> <u>Points</u>

- 1) Attendance
 - a) Clinic/Camp (one that you attend) 1 point per each 1 hour section with max of 3 points per day. If this is your home dojo the clinic/camp must be taught by a clinician 3rd Dan or higher not part of your dojo unless 3 or more dojos attend the clinic/camp.
 - b) Classes (that you attend or teach) 1 point for each 10 classes but no more than 25% of the points required for a promotion can be obtained by class attendance.
- 2) Officiating (referee/judging) shiai or kata tournaments you must be certified:

Requirements

This is a notice to the student as well as the instructor. All promotions are important because they build on each other. Trying to skip a rank can lead to considerable difficulty catching up. The founder of Judo was once asked what is most important and he said, "Never miss class". Your time in grade (TIG) is a measure of your active time in Judo not measured by days, months or even years only on the calendar. Your points are a measure of your achievements, competition and service to Judo and the USJA. You must keep a record of your Judo activity. The USJA Judo Activity Log is very useful in keeping your Judo records current. If you try and remember years after your last promotion what you did when and where, you will not only forget, you may lose the points you deserve.

Once a student has met the age requirement, accumulated the required number of points, has sufficient time-in-grade, has attended the required number of classes and/or is competitive with players in the next higher grade, and has displayed good overall conduct and dedication to the sport, he/she may be considered eligible for promotion.
