 big bugs that have already been discovered by hackers and are being actively used to attack people's
 iPhones.
- <u>Update your Chrome browser: Google releases important security fix</u>. This is an update you don't want to skip. If you see a notification to update your Chrome this week, don't ignore it. Google said it's now rolling out security updates for the browser to patch a vulnerability that's still being exploited in the wild.

You can open and view your files directly on your iPhone or iPad and run a variety of commands on them

• Chromebooks and Tablets Exploded in Popularity This Year. Google's constant efforts to make Chrome OS a viable alternative to Windows and macOS finally seem to be paying off. According to a recent report from Canalys, Chromebooks were the best performing client PC product in Q3 2020, with a 122% YoY growth in shipments. HP led the Chromebook market with 3.2 million units sold in the time period, with an annual growth of 116.9% and a market share of 34.1%. Lenovo took the second spot with an annual growth of over 300% and a market share of 18.9%. The remaining three spots in the top five were occupied by Dell, Acer, and Asus, in that order.
