- <u>CES 2021: What will you see at the world's biggest (all-digital) show</u>—The annual Computer Electronics Show (CES) goes online for the first time starting Monday, January 11, 2021. Preview the most-anticipated products and trends (and what's missing) at the world's biggest tech show.
- Adobe Flash Player is finally dead. Here's how to remove it from your PC or Mac. The end of 2020 was seen as a positive for many, but it was bittersweet in at least one way: Adobe finally, officially killed Flash Player. Anyway, Flash is gone for good and Adobe wants people to rid their computers of any remnants of Flash Player because it's not getting security updates anymore.
- Windows update to remove Adobe Flash may soon be available. Microsoft may end Flash by completely removing Adobe Flash Player from Windows 10 with an update. This update only removes Adobe Flash Player that was installed by your version of Windows. If you installed Adobe Flash Player manually from another source, you will need to read Uninstall Flash Player | Windows topic on the Adobe website.

1. Using OneDrive

#### ⇒ Windows 10—Backup & Recovery

- System Image Backup—In this video you will learn how to create System Image backup. It is an exact copy of your computer as it is right now. Think of it as a clone of your hard drive. If anything ever happens to your computer, the System Image will help you recover all of your data.
- File History

  In this video, you will learn how to use the primary tool built-into Windows 10 called File History. It allow you to not only back up your files, but also back up versions of those files so you can recover them in case you make a mistake. It will keep several versions depending on the frequency you set.
- 3. <u>System Retore</u>—This video shows you how to use System Restore to fix your computer, and how to check that System Restore is protecting your machine properly. System Restore lets you repair Windows 10 by turning back time to when things last worked properly.
