Ingredients

1 Cup	self raising flour
1tablespoon	cornflour

rabicspoon	commour
<sup>3</sup> ⁄4 Cup	sugar
2	eggs
<sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> Cup	milk

114g Butter, chopped

### Method

- 1a. Preheat oven to moderate (180C), Grease a Ring cake tin.
- 2a. Place all ingredients into a mixing bowl & beat for 6mins.
- 3a. Put mixture into ring tin & bake in moderate oven (180C or 350F) for 30mins
- 20. 250g (1/2lb) Square Fruit Cake presented on a firm base (NO paper plates of any type). 1/2lb refers to the quantity of butter in the cakes recipe.
- 21. Round Boiled Fruit Cake, presented on a firm base (NO paper plates of any type).
- 22. Date Loaf (uniced)
- 23. Butter Cake (uniced)
- 24. Banana Cake, lemon icing on top only.
- 25. Orange Cake, orange icing on top only.

### **BOWLS**

Bowls should be the standard 15cm black plastic florists bowls, and shall contain a miniblock of oasis. Bowl exhibits shall be allowed a space of 30cm overall diameter. Arrangements can contain buds, foliage and hips (if desired), and will be viewed all round. Bowls are judged for condition, overall beauty, presentation and foliage.
