"The Total Town Makeover-Youth Edition"



This workshop will highlight MCB student leaders and their outstanding community betterment projects that are a direct result of the planning session and mini-grant opportunity facilitated during the Youth Civic Leaders Summit (YCLS). Youth leaders will identify the motivations behind their projects, characteristics of outstanding service projects, and how projects have enhanced assets in their communities. "Left Behind: The Scars of the Great Recession & A Hopeful Future for Rural Missouri"

Nearly a decade after it began, the Great Recession has all but faded into memory. Or, has it? The stock market has fully recovered, corporate earnings are strong, the financial sector is thriving, and the economy is near full employment. Yet, ten years later, the pain and



scarring of the Great Recession remains for our rural and "distressed" communities. Yes, the Country has rebounded in many ways, but through this rebound, many rural Missouri communities have seen the new economy to be more unequal, less vibrant, less productive, and these rural economies are poorer, and sicker. For these vulnerable communities, national economic recovery bypassed them altogether. We must change that. We must work together to learn, to think, and to live differently. For rural Missouri, our future is not yet defined, there is much hope and opportunity. Dr. Sean Siebert specializes as a community innovation consultant, with an emphasis on rural economies. Join Dr. Siebert for his session, and learn about his work in the areas of innovation and entrepreneurship as they relate to community betterment. Siebert educates his audience on the value of understanding the concept that entrepreneurship is a mindset, not an occupation. During this session, Dr. Siebert shares his methodology and approach, and he provides a strategic line of questioning, that will enable communities to utilize the process of innovation for their own community betterment. The core focus is as follows: (1) What does it mean to think like an entrepreneur? (2) How do we re-think what we do? (3) How do we begin to see the world, and opportunities, through a different filter? (4) How do we re-invent ourselves? (5) What does that process look like? Throughout the session, Dr. Siebert addresses these strategic questions, and he shows each audience exactly what that world, and process, looks like. Relatable to every person, on every level, this will be a session full of innovation, energy, opportunity, and strategy.
