A Note from Plumbing Team:

It is highly recommended that everyone gets to know their neighbors. Exchanging contact info with residents in your own building can be more important than you think. There is always the possibility of a water leak, or other emergency that may require access to a neighboring unit or garage to complete the repair. Even though we re-piped the water service lines, water or drain leaks can still occur. As a good neighbor we look out for one another. If you detect water in your unit (where it does not belong), please check with your neighbors immediately. Water may not appear in the unit with the problem.

We ask that if a resident sees water, cannot find the source, and has confirmed with a neighbor the leak is not in their unit, call Severson Plumbing. They are the HOA's plumber and have over 10 years' experience working in the community. Severson's information is in every newsletter. The HOA is responsible for the structural integrity of waterlines and drains. However, if someone has flushed or put food down the garbage disposal and clogged a line, those types of repairs would be responsibility of the homeowner. If you are unsure, describe the situation to Severson Plumbing and they may be able to tell you whether it's homeowner or HOA responsibility.

Finally, residents who store personal property in their garage do so at their own risk. The walls of the garages do not seal flush with the floor. Be aware water can travel from a neighbor's garage into yours. A few common reasons for water appearing in a garage are: 1) water heater failure 2) laundry overflow or failure or 3) a neighbor hosing down their garage not realizing they will be running water into neighboring garage. (*None of these scenarios would involve Severson Plumbing.*) We recommend raising any items off the ground a few inches to protect your property. Regardless of the source of water in your garage, if you suffer any property loss, the HOA is not responsible. Any claim for property loss would go through the homeowner's insurance policy.


