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Del. 6-1917. Wood history only refers to this as a motor hose car to replace the horse drawn wagon at Boughton St. station. Later he tells of this being disabled on 1-17-1926 and retired...replaced by 2nd 1926 Seagrave.

Shipped 10-9-1920 75 Comb Jr. Town reports do not clearly mention this one until 1927 but says that by 1922, all Vol Co had motor cars. Wood says DFD received this but doesn't indicate assignment. Wood says this truck was assigned in 1931 to Water Witch's quarters with a paid crew.

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One of the Seagraves was an emergency purchase after the 1917 Pope failed... Del. 3-10-1927. Goes to Beckerle when the Autocar comes.

1 of 2 purchased. One of these went to Beckerle in 1931 when the Autocar was purchased. Citizens Hose Co. purchased their Mack in 1928 for \$1050 and the trade of a 1926 Seagrave which was obtained from city dept.
