

DEVOTIONS

Read: John 2:1-22

lesus goes from turning water into an abundance of wine at a wedding to arriving in Jerusalem and announcing his uncompromising judgment in the temple. Both images of Jesus are critical sanctuaries. The same message is in John, and it is not new. We can worship wherever we are. forceful actions is that his body is the real temple. Jesus, as the word made flesh (John 1:14), to the Gospel of John.
