

## **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

May 1, 2024

St. Luke's Family and Friends,

One of the best parts of being a pastor is the opportunity we clergy get to see our people at their absolute best. We get to be around when those who are sick start to feel better and more like themselves. I get to be a part of family celebrations, like baptisms, confirmations, graduations, and weddings. These are precious times and I've treasured every one of them over the years. We are on the midst of celebration season and I hope your family will be a part of our celebration with our confirmands later this month. However, these are not the only times I'm around families.

Some of the hardest times make forever impressions, as well. Over many years as a pastor, I've sat with families who lost children in car accidents, a family who lost a son-in-law in a plane crash, and a young wife and mother who lost both her husband and only child in an accident. I've sat with many families receiving or wrestling with difficult diagnoses. We read about tragic accidents and devastating illness, and we hear about them on the news. Our hearts still break, but it is special when we know those involved, when we know those in the car, or at the scene, or who are given the hard news. When we are a part of the family or community experiencing these losses, it hits differently. Our hearts hurt in deeper, more personal ways when it is those we know and love.

Recently, our community was touched by this type of loss and it was shocking. However, it was not the first time, and it will not be the last. We all know it shouldn't take something as shocking as an accident seemingly out of nowhere to remind us of how fragile life is – but it often does. We too quickly forget this fragility, and the privilege we have to live, and breathe, and simply be in this world. Each day is a gift from God for which we can give thanks, a day to hold our children, parents, friends and loved ones a little closer. We must recognize the moments we have are precious and not promised, but instead gifts for which we should be immensely grateful.

During this season of celebration, as we consider the accomplishments of confirmands and graduates, the forming of families in sharing wedding vows and those welcoming new life, I hope your family has many reasons to give thanks. I also would challenge all of us to be thankful for our lives and the lives close to us each morning and each evening. Nothing is more precious than the time we are given together and no other treasure on earth lasts into eternity.


