Many of our lives are crowded by the voices and sounds of the people all around us sharing their ideas and opinions. Yet, many of us fail to sift through the voices out there to hear and truly listen to the Lord's voice in regard to this journey daily. Sometimes we need to find a way to hear His voice more clearly and seek to understand His words more intentionally.

During the past few months I have returned to some classic music and preaching I listened to in my early years. I realize that we all grow and change throughout our lifetime. Yet,

there are some foundational things that formed who we are and what will direct our steps as we grow. These are the things that we must return to every now and again to remind ourselves of the ways God moved in our past to direct our future. Just as the Hebrews were directed to pick up stones from beneath their feet as they crossed the Red Sea, we pick up stones during the foundational events in our lives. We take those stones and form an altar on the other side. And we remind ourselves of the lessons learned each time we pass by the pile of stones. There is a familiar song we sing that has this phrase, "here I raise my Ebenezer" which refers to that altar building act to remind us later of the decision to obey now in the present.

God has called me to serve the church. For many years I have been fortunate to have many wonderful people come across my path to help direct, teach, guide, and encourage me. The Lord has used these people and many experiences to form and shape me into who I am today. The days of going into the field and walking with my brothers and sisters in missional contexts may be less now than in the past. However, my call to encourage and challenge remains. The time I spend traveling to the ends of the earth or to the forgotten village may change in this season, but my passion for reaching the world has not diminished. Where we go from here is not a simple answer at this point. But what is clear is our call to proclaim the whole truth of the Gospel message in everv
